Why integrate with reality?

Nothing is more persistent than reality. You have a relationship with reality and that relationship is unique, nobody else can think quite like you do. No one will satisfy your interests as well as you.



Since reality is abstract, identifying reality requires the ability for abstraction. Humans are not born with this ability, nor do animals have this ability to any

significant extent. Identifying reality also requires honesty, as you cannot pretend yourself into another dimension. Identifying reality both honestly and abstractly requires being conscious of it. Increasing the effective use of your consciousness is self-development.

How you integrate with reality

Thinking is linguistic; a complete sentence forms a complete thought. The most important property of language is the use of metaphor, which describes an unfamiliar concept by saying that it is like another, more familiar concept. Anything abstract in reality, including yourself, you understand as a metaphor. Metaphors are required to narrate storylines, setting entities apart in abstraction, and to build analogies or analogs, such as maps. Since "I" is an analog, and "me" is a metaphor, you place your abstract self into a narrative; anticipation for your own sake, for example, requires a narrative¹. When you imagine any amount of time through history, you use an analog of a drawn timeline, even though that timeline does not represent time itself. A model is a metaphor of data. This is how your mind processes information with conceptual thought.



What is being described here is consciousness, which is the faculty that identifies existence. Consciousness cannot exist without existence. It is the act that makes it possible, that is, reality is perceived through the effects on your consciousness. You can only be conscious by being conscious of something. Identifying reality is an active process; a consciousness without anything to be conscious of is not a consciousness. Nor can a consciousness be aware of itself and claim to be

independent of existence, because if a consciousness is aware of itself, then it must itself exist and be an existent. Consciousness can only be understood metaphorically because it functions as a metaphor generator.

What consciousness is and is not

The most plausible explanation of the existence and origin of consciousness comes from a psychologist and anthropologist at the Princeton University, Dr. Julian Jaynes. In his book, "The Origin of Consciousness: The Breakdown of the Bicameral Mind" he described what consciousness is and is not:

Consciousness is not²:

- Not a property of interacting matter
- Not a fundamental property of living things
- not learning
- not a metaphysical imposition
- not passive
- not evolution
- not behavioral
- not a part of the physical nervous system
- not a copy of existence
- not needed for non-abstract concepts
- not needed to learn
- not needed for thinking
- not needed for reason

Metaphor: Needed for abstract understanding and analogs

metaphrand: thing to be described

metaphier: thing used to describe

Paraphors: The metaphor of a metaphor. Needed for spacialization.

paraphier: extra descriptive quality of a metapheir (snow blankets the ground)

paraphrand: Projected description from a paraphier onto something to be described

("blankets" has an extra descriptive property). What the metaphors are doing, say create "mind space" paraphrand of a 'space' and the paraphier of what there is in that space.

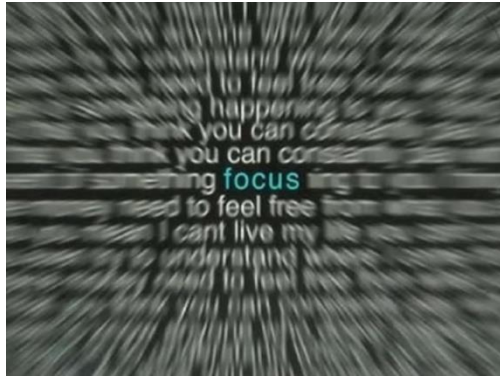

The metaphorical property of language allows one to metaphorically place oneself into a narrative. A narrative is a form of thinking that follows a directional process; directional thinking is a narrative. As a person's knowledge base grows, so does the complexity and number of narratives that one can metaphorically place



the "me" and "I" into. This gives one the ability to direct one's thinking process in order to choose the best course of action, or not; to focus (directing one narrative) or not focus (allow more than one narrative

streaming in one's mind); to be honest (narrative recognizing reality exists as an absolute) or dishonest (purposely focus on a subjective narrative to mislead); etc. You use your mind because you have control over it, if you do not have control over your mind, you are not using it. This process of consciousness is expanded by increased valid knowledge. This means that you are capable of being the author (authorize) of your narrative. The more valid knowledge you acquire, the more you become your own authority, and the less you demand authority from your environment. Free will is caused by the metaphorical property of language and enabled by the amount of knowledge you possess.

Unlike anything else in nature, you do not have an automatic means of survival, and cannot rely on automatic thoughts and



feelings to guide you. Like it or not, you are responsible for what you do. **Integration of reality is an active process.** To consciously think by reason is not automatic, it requires effort to connect concepts together that is congruent with its context. Observable data does not become information without effort. To say that your judgments are incapable of analyzing multiple rational narratives is to say that you are not capable of learning objective information at all. Anyone who claims that they have no will of their own is saying that conclusions are arrived by revelation as opposed to any process of conscious reason. A person that puts forth effort into one's thought process knows to act rationally on the basis of one's desires, not by reacting to them. The more conscious you are of yourself, the more ability you will have in curbing your impulses by shifting your focus via rational purpose. Consequently, the less conscious you are, the more impulsive you will be.

Consciousness is not the product of nature, it is man-made. No other animal has the complex linguistic capacity for consciousness. Your mind (the ability to abstract by use of metaphor) is not something that humans are born with. Children only learn to be conscious as they learn how to use metaphorical language and have an inventory of personal knowledge that they can then use for metaphorical abstractions. Thus children do not have the full ability to curb their impulses (because of a lack of self-understanding) and control their environment. Some people never fully grow

into control of either themselves or their environments, and thus never become full adults. This is why subliminal advertising works on



“adults”, because many go through life without knowing their environments and themselves well enough.

Your past conditioning allows you to create metaphors that enables you to constantly and selectively operate on unknowns such as future action, decisions, and re-creating narratives of "memories⁵." Analog tools, such as devices that tell time and writing curb the impulsive, automatic, and non-force submissive behavior. It also enables one to control the environment. Generating metaphors expand the context of one's relationship with reality. Your judgment becomes less subject to conditioning and becomes more of a conditioner. This is the basis of controlling your environment; it is your only metaphysical freedom you have⁶.

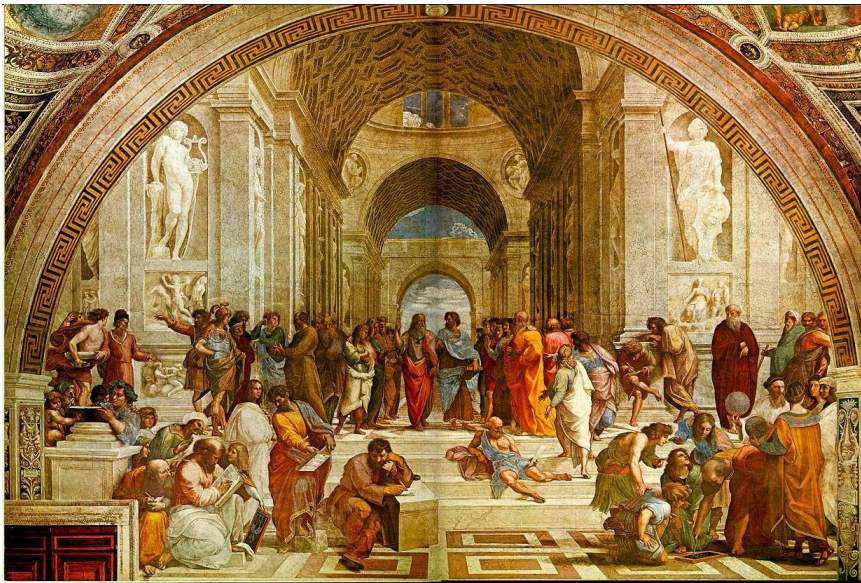
You may feel as you have free will to do a certain action because you had free will in a chain of thoughts to have the value judgments and the free will to focus on them consciously. You cannot directly will an action. Free will does not consist of the ability to take uncaused action, the ability to will uncaused emotion, ability to evade reality via uncaused conclusions. You cannot will the non-existent into existence. You only have the free will

to put effort into conscious thinking, focusing (the level of focus), etc.

You have the free will to use your consciousness to be aware of, direct, and focus your thought process. Your purpose is determined by the thoughts you are consciously aware, which direct you to where you are going and presupposes action; after all, you become what you think about⁷. Therefore consciousness allows for man to control his long range values by having the free will to set his own standards. Alternatively laziness and dishonesty are also volitional choices. **Free will is the epistemological freedom *not* to do something (to curb impulses).**



Reality is inevitably an abstraction from your viewpoint. That is why your perceptual faculty does not work properly without your conceptual faculty. Your consciousness perceives reality because it is a process of metaphor generation. These metaphors allows you to

operate on a level of abstraction that is not possible without them. Reality is too abstract to be understood by automatic thoughts and feelings. You have to be able to focus your mind independently in order to learn facts objectively. If you claim not capable of this, then you cannot claim any knowledge at all.

Consciousness is finite, like anything else at any given time frame. You can take many percepts and condense them into a unit. This process however is volitional, it requires effort to do this. Like anything else that requires volition, it can be exercised⁸. One can focus on a particular narrative in the same way (metaphorically) that you focus your eyesight.

Just go to a quite empty room and close your eyes. Think of three different narratives in your mind. Maybe one of them is flying above the mountains in Alaska. Take about ten seconds or so on each until you get to the third narrative when after some time you focus on it in



detail. Perhaps you will do four, or maybe none at all. This is not something that has to be dictated by outside forces. That is what active consciousness is, and it is

the result of the inventory of knowledge you have and the ability to think in metaphors which allows you to focus on one narrative, multiple, or none at all.

You direct your thoughts away from your environment by using metaphors in your thinking. Nature does not make metaphors, they are completely man made. They are made possible by the accumulation of knowledge (that is past experiences and vocabulary to describe them) from the past millennia. As there is an array of knowledge, there are different ways to make up metaphors and thus analog tools for consciousness to operate on. It is because of the volumes of information that exists is the reason each individual's consciousness is not like the other.

Cultivating free will

You can automatize an action when it becomes a matter of rote experience. That is, when a task is well understood and mastered, then one can perform it unconsciously. For example, when one is first learning to drive, you had to be conscious of how much to step on the gas pedal to give the engine fuel, or how much force to turn the steering wheel to get the vehicle to turn, etc. Once you mastered these skill sets, you can simply drive without being fully conscious of driving, that is, without being critically self-aware while stepping on the gas pedal. This is true for practically all knowledge. Since you can only focus your consciousness on a fixed amount at any given time, you will free up "mind space" in order to focus on more complex or value producing tasks. For example, ice skating is a skill that takes conscious learning to do at first, but once you learn how to do it, you will no longer even have to be conscious to do it, and

therefore be able to do other things while you ice skate, such as talking. Once you learn at a certain skill level, you will be able to express at that level creatively.

As your knowledge increases, you can form analog tools to help you identify things for what they are, put them



into the proper context, and use your free will to consciously decide how to think about the thoughts that you have about them. As your valid knowledge base increases, your mind "strengthens." Since thinking is linguistic, it helps to

have a mental inventory of definitions of words and be able to deconstruct complex words to get an approximation of their meaning. Being able to construct sentences clearly helps you to also think clearly. By contrast, invalid knowledge and dishonesty allows you to accept subjective notions. This makes your certainty less grounded, and gives you less reason to be confident. By learning *invalid* knowledge, your ability to survive is inhibited.

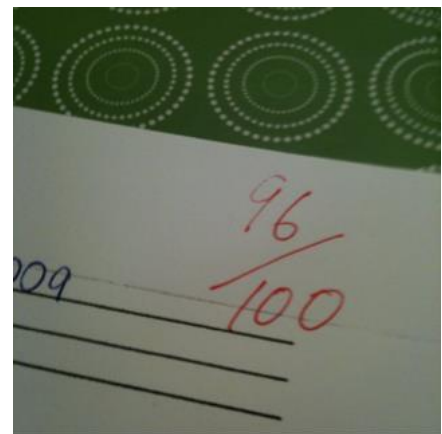
Growing into control

You must have at least some ability to control your environment in order to achieve your goals. The more control over your environment, the more effective you are. You establish a certain kind of order in this process, one that fits a purposeful context. After all, how do you establish any kind of order without the purpose needed to provide the context for it? With each purpose there is

a different formulation of order for it. For every person there is a different definition of what is orderly.

The mind has one purpose: To purposeful action⁹. It does this by curbing impulse. The very use of active consciousness is by definition is impulse control. To be overwhelmed by non-force external factors is the basis of impulse. Impulses are the result of unprincipled reaction to emotion. It can come from subjective notions, from other semi-conscious people posing as an authority to you (call it external authority), or directly as symbols from the physical environment. All of which misdirect you from your purpose, whatever that may be. You cannot establish order for yourself unless you can think independently from others.

By setting a goal for your thought processes you can judge if you are going in the right direction or not. You do this by using operant conditioning on yourself; just like how you judge yourself after getting a good or bad grade on a test. By using your narrative processes you can focus or not by either using one narrative, or default into laziness and allow for many, unconstructed narratives. You can default into laziness and not put forth the effort into taking the rational action, of course you will end up with nothing for this. You may

shift your focus if your goals change. Consciousness enables one to condition oneself. If you are developed consciously enough, you can change the choices you make.

Consciousness only provides direction, otherwise it hinders other activities. So only its materials, preparation, and its end results are needed to be conscious. A conscious mind requires a method of operation in order to control reality. Those who do not fully integrate with reality end up with some ideology that is supposed to "replace" reality. This is because the mind needs certainty in order to be confident that it is moving forward effectively. Those who are not consciously certain will look for it, often with disastrous results.

When someone conditions you, that person is an external authority to you. When you condition yourself based on your own standards, you are your own authority. Because each individual has its own purpose, each individual has its own standard of survival and therefore means of working effectively. When you are learning from others, you are actually learning for yourself. It is not to say that learning from others means that you are being conditioned by them, you are simply conditioning yourself based from knowledge that was produced by another person. Proper knowledge means being conditioned on the basis of reality. In order to take control of your learning, one needs to understand the conditioning process mentioned earlier.

Since you start out in life unconscious, you will be conditioned on terms not on your own. If you do not grow into control, you will be conditioned by others, and will be unhappy as a result because you will not be living by the requirements for your survival, that is your purpose. The usefulness of knowledge depends on the context of that purpose, if the learning (conditioning) is not beneficial to you, that learning is not meeting the requirements for your survival.

Using faculties to form knowledge.

Senses perceive reality as sensory data as evidence, and then identified by some level of consciousness. Even different sense data from two different people cannot contradict, even if so to a third party. Because they are both honest perceptions of reality, useful within their own contexts. Your senses are determined by sensory organs and can only take some form. The only time your senses are wrong are if your own faculties are a disvalue to you, such as having hallucinations. Being wrong is not grounds to denounce your faculties, it does mean that you need to gain a better conceptual understanding of what you do. Differences with perception do not matter in the face of concepts.

From senses to concepts

Your senses are obviously not enough. Sense data alone cannot identify reality; you need to have a conceptual faculty to validate your senses¹⁰. Without conceptual thinking, you will be fooled by simple optical illusions. Human thought and action are conceptual phenomenon. Human cognition consists of conceptual thinking, which arises from perceptual material. Concepts are the means of organizing percepts in order to expand knowledge beyond the percepts. Concepts allow you to organize perceptual data by categories of classification.

Before one can consistently form thoughts and principles (i.e., perform integrated thinking), one needs to know how to form concepts. What follows are the six steps to form concepts¹¹:

1. **Differentiation:** a person mentally isolates two or more entities from other entities and notices that these two or more entities are different from the other entities.
2. **Similarity:** one then sees how these two or more entities are similar to each other.
3. **Measurement omission:** by seeing that these entities are essentially similar but not exactly the same, one omits the particular differences in measurement (i.e., specific differences in weight, height, length, color, etc.).

4. Integration: omitting specific measurements enables one to unite these similar entities into one unit, which is a concept.
5. Labeling: one labels the concept with a visual/auditory symbol, which is a word.
6. Definition: one attaches a definition to the concept to distinguish it from all other concepts.

A concept has purpose and changes with context. A concept is not a definition, however a definition is required for a concept¹². A concept is a single entity. A concept is not a proper name or has specific measurements. A concept has to be validated to the perceptual and concrete level. They are essential for reasoning:

Reasoning = logic + concept formation

Application of the faculties

Integrating conceptualized facts by logic is called reason.



Logic is congruency within a context with the purpose to identify that which exists. Existents have no fuzzy boundaries. They are entities in reality such as

your computer, car, girlfriend, etc. Most concepts also have no fuzzy boundaries: they fall into one definite category of entities or another. Existents are metaphysical entities while concepts are epistemological entities¹³. It is your conceptual faculty that enables you to reason in order for you to identify reality.

On learning

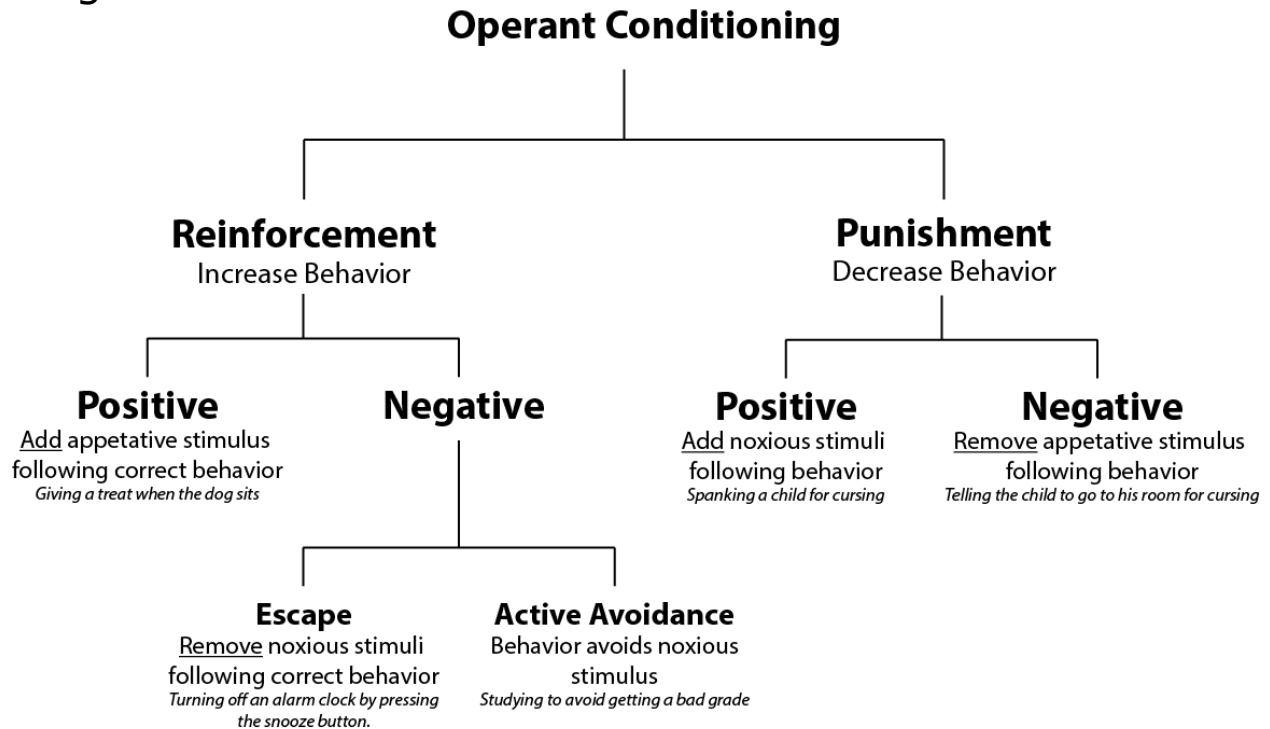
Science is the integration of mechanics and mathematics. Cause and effect is action plus identity¹⁴. Cause and effect does not tell you what the cause is, just what happens when there is a cause. Reasoning is either from abstraction (deduction) or from observation (induction).

Emotions are very much a part of learning as well. Motivation itself is emotional. Your brain recognizes pleasure and pain. Emotions are the basis of the pleasure and pain principle, which give rise to the automatic response system of yourself. Emotions are automatic feelings and thoughts are not identifiers of reality, but simply serve the function of being approximations in your dealings with reality. Reality cannot be effectively dealt with in unprincipled automation mode, therefore it is very important that you take conscious control of your own conditioning process.

Positive presence of a stimulus

Conditioning forms convictions. Convictions form the basis of value judgments, which are the basis of your emotions.

Consciously learning means being aware of your own conditioning, which is being critically aware of the information that you are receiving. To do otherwise is to

learn unconsciously, and thus the source of that information acts as an external authority. This does not mean that you do not learn from others, it just means that you learn critically. Critically examining the content of others is necessary in order to judge the validity of the information. Reality exists as an absolute, but the relationship is not unprincipled and automatic.

Reason is the means of identifying reality. Reason is limited in two ways: bounds within context, and correlates with reality via honesty.



Reason engages in critical examination by identifying absolutes, and doing so with purpose. Controlling reality is the goal. Cultivating the ability to consciously controlling you and your environment is the root of any virtue. The ability to reason itself has to be exercised, it too is a virtue that underlies the ability to control your environment.

Error, statistics, and evaluations

-You cannot call yourself erred unless you know you were using an invalid method. This is because omniscience is not a standard of knowledge, if it were, you will be completely resistant to new knowledge that will contradict your previous understanding. It does not

follow that if you are wrong once, that your faculties are inherently wrong¹⁶.

-Statistics are only valid if there is an action needed to be taken and there is unavoidable ignorance of a concrete. Statistics are not facts themselves, but at best approximations of them¹⁷.

-Your evaluations are the application of your value judgments. Your emotions can be grounded in reality if your evaluations are formulated by reason. Emotions are automated processes that arise from your evaluations.

On self-control

-Suppression: Means you consciously acknowledge the emotion, but because the emotion is not appropriate, it is set aside. Suppression is a useful method for avoiding harmful mystical notions and reactions that are based on that emotion.

-Repression: Means trying to deny an emotion by permanently forcing it out of the conscious mind. That act is a mystical distortion of reality, for emotions are a real, approximation to your relationship with reality.

You never have to act on negative emotions, but you should always acknowledge negative emotions.

The need for rational principles

Everything has a fundamental nature. Since you have your own purpose, you must form your own valid principles; as all strategy is principled. Rational principles are the tools to control reality. The application of principles allows your method to dictate content, and your context to dictate the condition. A principle is a fundamental generalization and is the deepest integration possible within a context; Principles are validated or invalidated by integration with the entity involved. You do not observe principles in specifics, but need principles to explain the specifics¹⁸. Valid principles allow you to predict the future because they are timeless. An example of a rational principle is: "Act in accordance to self-preservation."

Not all principles are valid however. Principles are formed by induction and must be checked by deduction¹⁹. Many insane ideologies also have sets of principles. The last thing you want is a guide to action that does not correspond to reality that hinders your survival. An example of an irrational principle is: "Submit to authority."

Always reject irrational principles, the unprincipled, and faith as cognitive standards. When you disregard a principle, you throw it out as a guide: Disregard the

irrational and accept the rational. Survival requires you to think and act rationally.

Application of rational principles



Happiness can only be generated by controlling reality in the long run. Living by a set of rational principles means living in accord to your own nature. This means full psychological independence and having contextual certainty in your own abilities and faculties; since you cannot purposely order anything in your environment when you question your own faculties.

The wider and more valid your knowledge base, the more you have control of. This allows you to approach problems at different angles by starting out in some far out position where no one would normally think, as if to

give a very different vantage point to a problem. This makes you both logical and unpredictable. Mastery of this gives you a competitive advantage over many people.

Once a problem is set up in an orderly, logical manner by the aid of principled thinking, it can then be processed by one's unconsciousness more effectively. Creative thinking goes through three stages: First it is prepared, organized, and consciously worked over; then it is unconsciously incubated; then a creative solution may be reached that is then later justified by reason. Mastery of this also can yield a competitive advantage over many people.

Effort into active use of one's consciousness and principled thinking is pushed by competition as a result of scarce resources.

Value production for survival

You produce a value when you control something to make it more suitable for yourself; value is an object of action. If action is irrelevant to its possession, then it is not a value²⁰. To value something means being alive; a robot for example does not have values; it is not alive. An organism's life is its standard of value. Your needs are your values; an "ought to" is derived from an "is."

What you value forms the basis of your emotions. Emotions are value judgments, that tell you what your values are, and emotions are approximations with your relationship with reality. Emotions are the sensations of a gain or loss of value. They are automatic estimates of one's relationship with reality. What someone will tell you is virtuous tells you a lot about that person.

Your likes and dislikes are what determines where you want to go in life. This is why you should make plans for outcomes of events, it helps you take action to control your environment. Doing this will put you ahead of mediocre people.

Rational self-interest means doing what you need to do in order to survive. The principle of values is the achievement of happiness. Value is the object of an action, to value death is merely not valuing life, and to not think yourself as worthy of happiness, you will not pursue it. Purpose sets the context of values. Rational virtues are reason, rationality, independence, purpose, self-esteem, and honesty. The only values you have in order to exchange with others is your rational thought, time, and effort.

Value production + value reflection = happiness

What does this all mean?

There is a difference between earned trust brought about by reason and unearned trust brought about by faith. You may cross a bridge because you do not have any reason to believe that it is structurally unsound; not because you have faith in it. By crossing that bridge you are operating on the rational principle of your past experiences of the concept "bridge." You cannot act on something that is outside of your awareness; you cannot expect yourself to be omniscient. Your relationship with reality is an abstraction. At some point you will have to automatize since you cannot expect yourself to split your conscious attention everywhere and all of the time. When you do automatize, you must first make a conscious decision that it was formulated on your reality based, rational faculty into a guide to action that is a principle.

There is an inverse relationship between the usefulness of a person's consciousness and its suggestibility to outside influences. External scripting is designed to make you a good servant to the collective. Being independent means living by one's own efforts and exchanging those efforts for the efforts of others. Independence is not isolation, it is the virtue of self-sufficiency in value production, whether that value production is self-discipline or conscious self-direction. You make your own decisions based on your own rational self-interest, which frees you from the parasites existing today. Whenever a person becomes virtuous enough, that person realizes that losing their independence

equates to their own death and therefore works hard to keep that independence. If one does not control one's own environment, one is subject to it.

Since every person is somewhat different from another, you are fundamentally alone in existence. You can be in a room full of people without changing the fact that not a single one of them is anything like you. This is the good news. Since you are self-interested, you cannot care more about another than yourself by definition. Relationships are intangible assets.

Adversity is a gift for those who have a good attitude. Virtue promotes free will and vice takes it away. There is always inequality and risk. Charisma comes as a result of certainty, success, and good health.

The goal here is to learn how to be authoritative for yourself, and not to accept any higher authority than yourself. Actions cannot be based in pleasure alone, but must take into account reason. The litmus test to successfully development is being uninhibited by non-purposeful stimuli.

Chapter two

Why you cannot afford to be a follower

No one is going to take care of your needs altruistically, all rational authority is selfish. If you believe otherwise, you will effectively become a tool of that authority. Do not take some guru seriously if he told you not to become an engineer because you are too good for it. Do not sacrifice your relationship reality for the easiness of direction from somebody else. Following others is not a virtue; self-discipline always trumps institutionalized discipline.

Non-force submission is impulse resulting in a lack of self-discipline. Without a fully developed consciousness, one reacts in the same way an animal reacts: submitting to nature. Nature does not intend that you govern yourself, which is why nature gives you automatic reactions such as



emotions. Nature on its own cannot fulfill your drives.



Organization is valuable to an organism. In nature, that order is determined by nature. A flower does not determine its order, nature

does. This natural determinism is true for everything from bacteria to galaxies, but not for those who are fully



conscious. Flowers, bacteria, and galaxies are not conscious; they do not think in metaphors.

Nature exists as a result of an order that had developed over the course of eons. Anything that contained more entropy moved out of existence faster than what had less. Galaxies hold together as a result of gravity; animals that could not survive cataclysmic events died out into extinction. In nature, the order does not require conscious effort, but in humans it does. For an animal, food that is harvested gives the living organism values that maintains itself. The animal gains the value by some process of non-conscious automation. For a human, gaining a value has the same effect, except it is gained by volitional effort that



requires consciously controlling nature. Even the DNA that you were endowed with by your parents required volitional effort to gain and keep. The knowledge that is given to you in this book for you to practice required effort from the writer. You are man-made, in a sense, invented. What causes order to you is not the same as what causes order in nature. You are volitional, you exist differently



from nature. Values acquired by humans requires a process that is different from any other process in nature; that is consciousness.

A fully conscious mind can be developed by you if you are willing to put forth the effort; your survival depends on you doing so. The power to build is also the power to control. If you are your own creator, you control yourself.

How you are opposed:

Force

Physical force is anti-consciousness, or anti-authority because it inhibits one from using the faculty of the mind. You cannot separate the individual from his mind; when a



person forfeits his mind, he forfeits himself. If a person acts on the principle that he can justifiably gain values by force, then he is a net cost to everything, including himself, he loses individuality by confirming that he cannot

live by his own efforts, instead needs to destroy and transfer those values. If you know that violence will be used against you, you have an objective right to use force; no matter if it is an individual or institution. It may be a good idea to learn good martial arts or carry



concealed weapons. The principle here is that you should not gain a value by force.

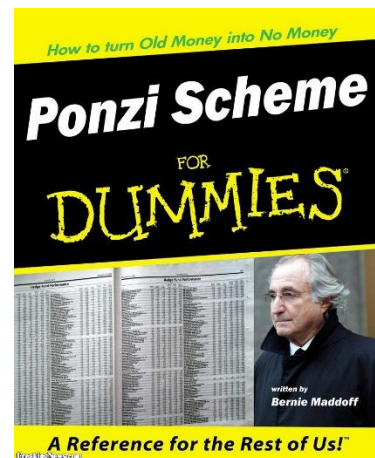
Fraud

Fraud appeals to the cognitive standard of faith and have to look real for it to be accepted. Here are some simple preventive measures:

- Watch those who attempt to force a narrative.
- Do not express valuables to people that have not earned your trust.
- Do not express personal information to people that do not need to know it.

Further, when the criminal deals with people who do not buy into the false narrative, a criminal will attempt isolate you or by inhibiting your individual authority by applying irrationality:

- Playing on a person's insecurity, paving the way for the victim to engage in self-doubt.
- Ad-homonym (attacking the person instead of subject).
- Straw man (re-inventing the person's position).
- Politician ("we") fallacy.
- Shield from criticism by claiming innate knowledge.
- Claiming "independence is isolation" and "discipline comes from external authorities."
- Stolen concept (using a concept to deny it).



- Inadequate context.
- Context shifting (such as shifting the blame).
- Non-sequitur (drawing a conclusion not entirely based on the premise).
- Downplaying your purpose if it is rational.
- Denouncing your faculties, even just by being wrong once.



You are easier to control when you automatize a behavior that is irrational. History is full of examples of authorities suppressing real knowledge in order to misdirect the masses for the purpose of making them susceptible to their

authority. False information is distributed for the purpose of created disorder within individuals' minds. People are less likely protest what parasitic rulers do if those people are finding difficult to bring order to their own personal lives. This makes people easier to control. You cannot grow and defend yourself at the same time because your time and energy are finite.

Individuals look for saviors to direct themselves out of the desperate situation they find themselves in, only to be led down a path of further disappointment. Weak individuals do not like to look into the mirror when they find themselves in a place or



situation they do not like, instead they tragically look to those who promise the “magic pill.” The problem is not the person that is attributed as the leader, but it is the follower who enables him.

Distorted relationships

You are most vulnerable in the area of sex, money, and a sense of “belonging.” Think about it, how many people you know work jobs they do not like? How many boys and girls do stupid things to impress the other? How many fall for peer pressure in advertisements?

The media conditions ethics to support something that is not in your self-interest. “Nerds” for example have low value according to entertainment media. Those who unconsciously allow such media to guide their thoughts will uphold an anti-nerd culture, so engineers for instance are valued less as a result. Because of the impulse to conform, many adapt to the problems that are conditioned by culture.

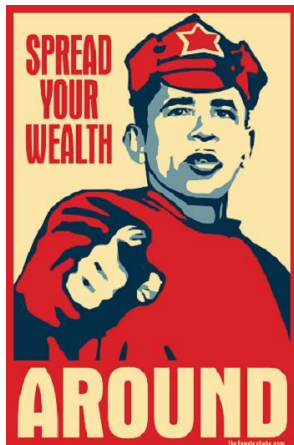
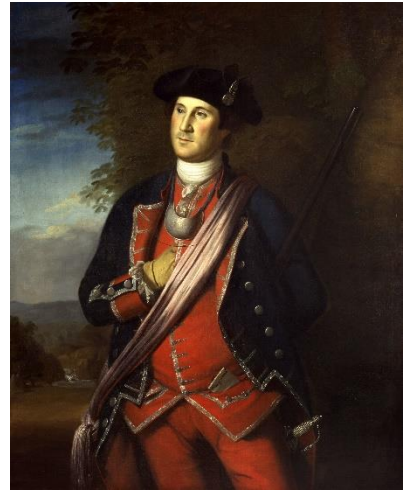


The entertainment media will have you use language improperly. Slang and sarcasm renders language less effective as tools of thought. People can only think as good as they can

speak in their native language, and when a person cannot arrange words into coherent rational structure, neither can they do the same with thought, thus making them easier to control.

Conditioning for tyranny

Government is force. Outside of its proper scope, it uses force to redistribute human interaction. Government misdirects relationships by subsidizing some people, and taxing others; taxing productivity and subsidize failure in the name of equality, yet this “equality” is not one of opportunity, but of outcome. In order for government to operate this way, the media



must manipulate people into thinking that there is a necessity to implement such programs, to then use the government as an enforcing arm of their agenda.

A person's value is contextual to another person. Force does not change that context, and being dishonest does not change who you are. There is no substitute for real value created by effort on your part.

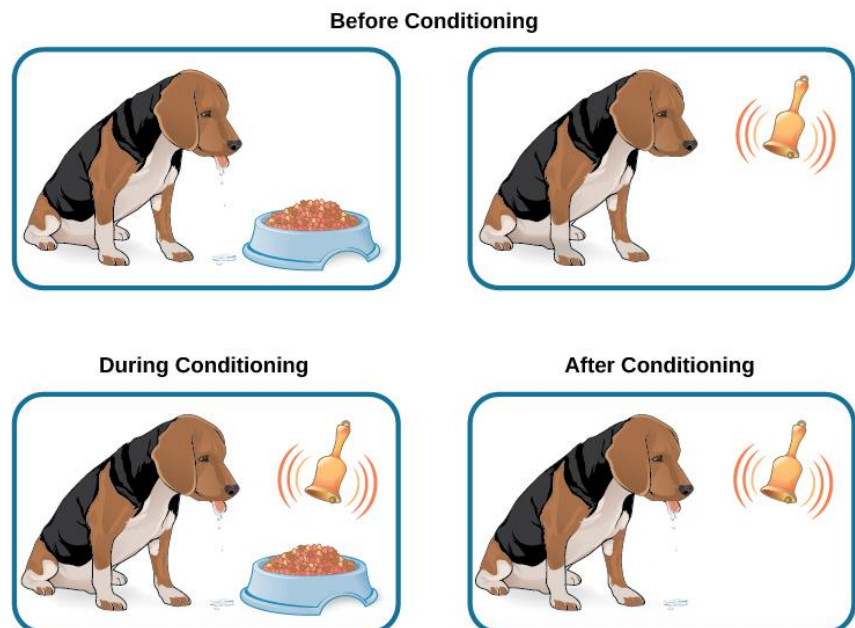
How to apply yourself as an external authority

Inevitably you will involve yourself with people who are not fully conscious. You need to understand their mindset and how to deal with them.

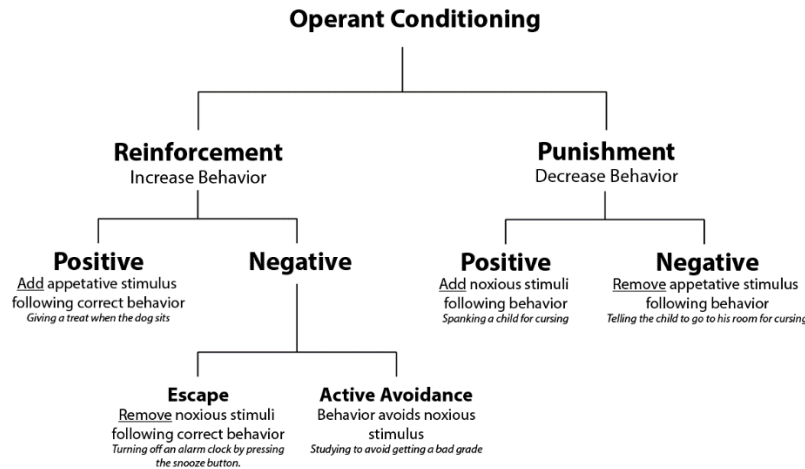
People are attracted to value in order to solve their problems, and in turn may be attracted to the authority outside of

themselves if it is lacking from within. You can apply operant condition on them: rejection if you want to rid a habit from the undeveloped mind, or you can express acceptance as an incentive for the

undeveloped mind to continue. You do this in a way similar to training a pet; rejection is like spanking a dog and rewarding is like giving it a treat. The weak mind is capable of emotions like fear, and does so at the prospect to rejection of something to the extent that it perceives that something as a value. Likewise the non-mind craves for the acceptance of what it deems valuable. So the undeveloped person typically wants praise from other people.



The speed itself at which you apply your explicit operant conditioning also has an effect. The faster, the more effective. Also, the less impulsive you act as a conditioner, the more effective. You want to be clear, consistent, and direct²¹.



Positive presence of a stimulus

Negative absence of a stimulus

Reinforcement increases behavior

Punishment decreases behavior

Escape removes a stimulus

Avoidance prevents a stimulus

What you do:

1. You had a means of reward.
 - a. Praising (saying "good job", or smiling and nodding your head).
 - b. Helping to the extent it is in your self-interest to.
2. You had means of punishment.
 - a. Rejection by saying no.

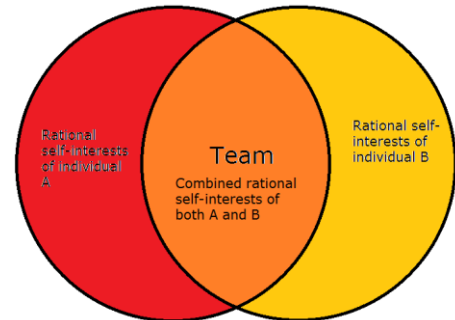

- b. Ignore them when they seek your attention.
- 3. Stating facts to trump their impulsive wishful thinking.
- 4. You were clear about what the goal was.
- 5. Punish the impulse if it affected the goal (consistency).
- 6. Everything you did was consistent with that goal, and your reward versus punishment mechanism was consistent on Mr. Impulsive.

What you do not:

- 1. Express any kind of impulse yourself, including frustration.
- 2. Allow their impulse to attack your values (disrespect).
- 3. Inconsistency.
- 4. Disorganization; such that anything you do is not completely in your control when it should have been (i.e. carpooling without taking into account where every person is going to sit).
- 5. Getting emotional.
- 6. Not punishing impulses if they affected the goal.

This is called “managing” people. Think of it as a one dimensional continuum with one side being the highest reward and the other being the highest form of punishment, and going from one end to another is like turning a knob. Your operant conditioning is like setting a temperature; you do not want it to be too hot or too cold. You can continue to control such a person by rewarding him whenever he does what you want him to do. Such a person may even altruistically submit itself to you.



You should receive respect, either by rationality or by conditioning. If someone is not rational, they need to at bare minimum respect you. People will ignore you sometimes because their mindless selves have been conditioned away from recognizing real value; ignore these people. Do not waste too much of your time convincing people that you are valuable as many people tragically shun logic and reasoning. People in North Korea for example are conditioned to feel that Kim Jung il is valuable. There is no net gain from deviating from reality in exchange for social acceptance. You cannot attract others without substance in the long run.

If an undeveloped person is successful with his impulsive behavior, he will only continue that behavior with greater enthusiasm. For example, if a person did not study for a math test and scored a passing grade because the

teacher curved the test, you cannot expect him to study for the next test.

It is easier to deal with impulsive individuals by applying operant conditioning on them quickly. Do not expect a person to be easier to deal with later if they are successful at messing around without recourse. You should have every bit of



control over yourself and those who are not fully conscious. If something goes wrong, it is your fault sine you cannot expect such a person to control himself.

If you are able to immerse an irrational non-minded person into indoctrination, you can build than person for you to control. Immersion usually works because the vast majority of people have not achieved the level of discipline that real independence requires. As such they are subject to external authority.

Dealing with irrational people

What if you are productively acting independently and someone does not like it? What if someone else uses

their operant conditioning on you in an attempt to determine you as if you had no impulse control of your own? This is a person who expects you to conform to their will. A person may incentivize you to do something, but it is an external authority that seeks you to react impulsively. One thing to remember is that two fully conscious individuals do not have authority over the other, otherwise the person will give way to another.



Examples dealing with irrational individuals:

Conflict 1

Manager: "I am your boss and I can incentivize you to do X."

- Act, but do not surrender yourself to their incentive; see the value for what it is.
- Act in your rational self-interest.
- Act with no emotion, especially not fear, but remember to smile.
- Competitively produce a value to exchange for another value that you need.

Often times individuals like this will be put off by you not submitting to them. Always remember that the value of your relationship with reality is the most valuable asset that you possess. Notice that an undeveloped person will

start to surrender as pressure is applied, but this will not happen as you develop. Not bending to pressure is the litmus test to strength of character.

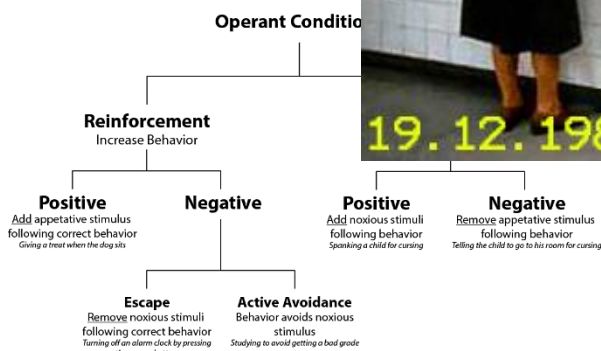
Conflict 2

If someone uses irrational associations²²:

Mr. Not Cool: "You're different because you are a nerd."

You: "That's because you are not smart enough to think differently."

Mr. Not Cool: "What was that punk?"



- Positive** presence of a stimulus
- Negative** absence of a stimulus
- Reinforcement** increases behavior
- Punishment** decreases behavior
- Escape** removes a stimulus
- Avoidance** prevents a stimulus

You ignore him and allow him to demonstrate his frustration. Use negative associations to re-focus the person. Impulse control is the anti-external authority; it

shifts focus away from abstraction to an animal state of mind. The frustration transfers power back to you.

Conflict 3

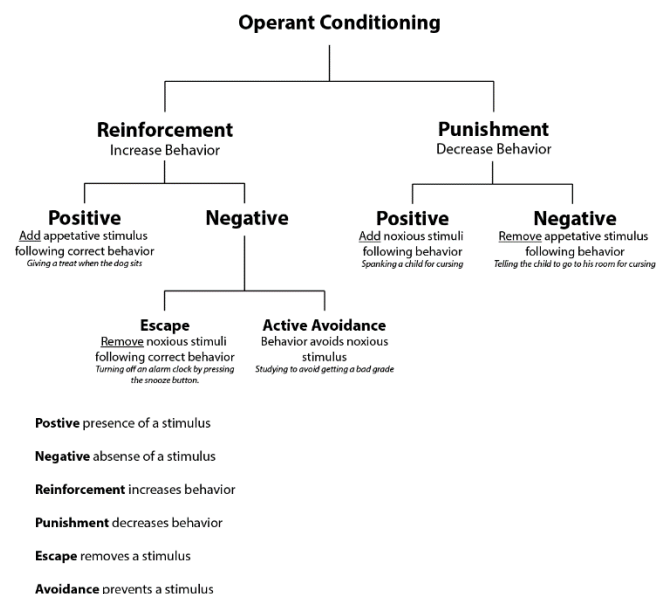
“I am an authority that represents the government and I am going to steal a piece of your property and call it taxation.”

This individual has an entire apparatus of force backing him up. So you can do nothing except condition individuals into equating taxation with theft.

Conflict 4

Mr. Not Cool: “You sound like a homosexual” *non-factual positive punishment*²³.

You: “I’m not” *Positive punishment by stating a fact.*

Mr. Not Cool: "Well you do anyway" *reinforcing by attempting to punish, but is less consciously directed.*

You: "That's too bad if that's what you were looking for." *Positive punishment by metaphor to help illustrate the abstraction. Metaphors are needed for abstractions, therefore abstractions are easier to communicate through metaphors.*

Mr. Not Cool: "Shut up" *reactive punishment attempt and a positive reinforcement for you.*



You: "Speak for yourself" *Positive punishment*

Notice how the only impulses being expressed is by Mr. Not Cool. Expressing any kind of frustration on your part is expressing yourself giving way to Mr. Not Cool's pressure.

Conflict 7

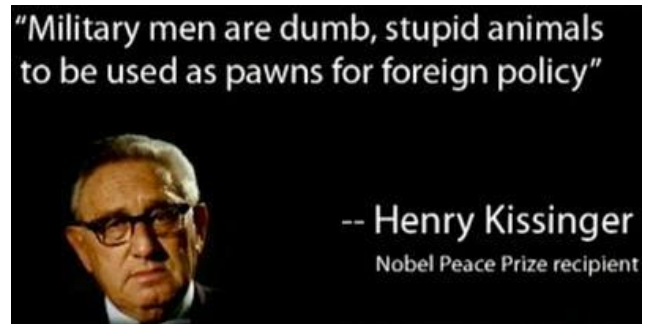
You join the military because you perceive a legitimate threat to yourself and property.

Drill sergeant: "You will be a pawn in foreign policy."

You: "Yes sir!" *You lied*

Drill sergeant: "you are going to use weapons and terrain to force followers of an external authority to submit to our will in defense of a less irrational civilization."

You: "Yes sir!" *You were honest this time. Wow, what a great opportunity to learn everything about force multipliers, such as the terrain and weapons.*



Conflict 5

You get drafted into the military against your will.



Drill sergeant: "You will be a pawn in foreign policy."

You: "Yes sir!" *You lied.*

You have no objective obligation for any part of that system since you are being held against your will. Again, the key here is to suppress any kind of fear you have and put such an emotion in its proper context. Any kind of giving way to pressure, even if it is screaming in your face, demonstrates lack of character.

Conflict 6²⁴

Professor Fruit: "You fail to submit to authority like a spoiled child." *Positive punishment by metaphor. This is an effective application of a fallacy because the metaphor helps to illustrate the abstraction.*

You: "no, I succeeded in not submitting to authority"

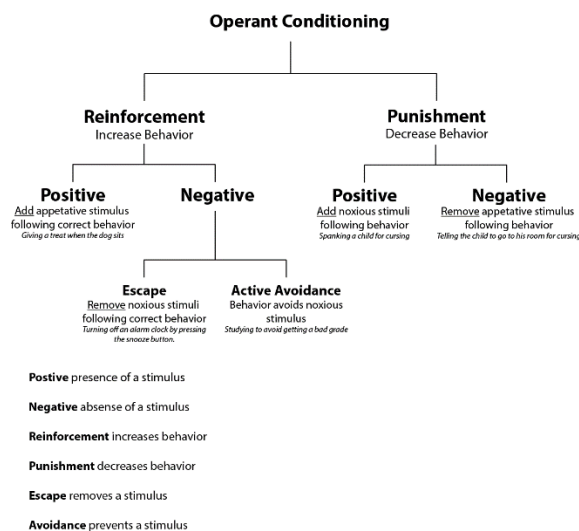
Professor Fruit: "Spoken like an emasculated person; you lack discipline." *slander, and using negative association to attempt to cause disorder within yourself.*

You: "You really don't get it, it takes a lack of discipline to submit." *Spoken with no frustration. You are not giving him any positive reinforcement.*

Professor Fruit: "You almost had me believe you... almost."

You: "Why didn't you?"

Professor Fruit: "Because you are delusional." or "You should stop thinking because you cannot do it properly." or *something else to that effect. Trying to denounce your faculties to create self-doubt to encourage impulsive reactions.*

You: "Here, read the first chapter in this book." or "Let me put this to you in my own words." *State facts over fiction.*

Professor Fruit: "Did you write that?"

You: "No, Mr. Z wrote it."

Professor Fruit: "Well it looks like you are a follower of his authority." *Using the "you too" fallacy.*

You: "I'm not. It's just how the mind works, he just did a good job in writing about it so that idiots like you don't equate submission with virtue." *Again, state fact over fiction.*

Professor Fruit: "What? No, that is not how people operate." *Attempting to use positive punishment.*

You: "yes they do." *Positive punishment by disagreeing.*

Professor Fruit: "No they don't. I know otherwise."

You: "How do you know?"

Professor Fruit: "It just comes to me, don't question it and accept it." *Making something innate protects it from criticism*

You: "If your supposed knowledge did not come from reason, then it is not knowledge." *Positive punishment by disagreeing and positive reinforcement by teaching him something of value.*

You are the manager of a company working with Mr. Gooff:

Mr. Gooffoff: "Why are you forcing me to do X"

You: "I'm not"

Mr. Gooffoff: "Well I thought you told me to do X"

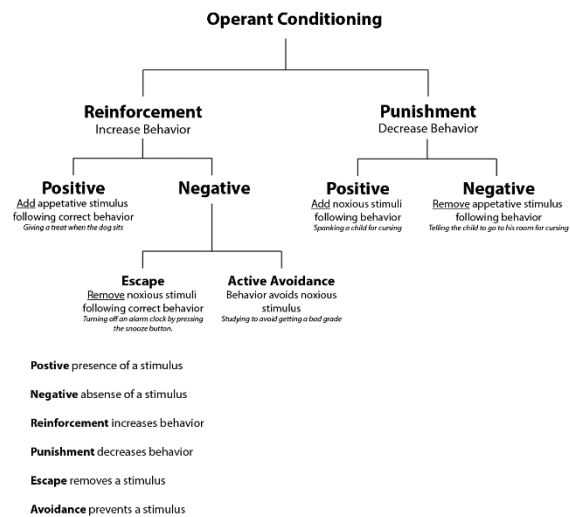
You: "I did"

Mr. Gooffoff: "I don't get it"

You: "That's because you are an idiot, but let me explain this to you. First, I have to tell you to do something because you either don't know better or you are goofing off while the company is paying you, which is stealing. Second, I have a little less respect for you because you are not as productive as I would expect you to be. Third, I am not forcing you do to anything, if you don't like what I expect you do to, then by all means, walk out of here."



Exercise vigilance on those who charge you with your time, money, and energy. In business some will unnecessarily charge you more than they should, thinking that you are not paying attention. Do not let an arbitrary notion or charge go unchallenged.



You own a book store and interview a woman for a position. You do not like this girl, and decide not to hire her²⁵.



Feminist: “You are sexist for not hiring me into position Y, you are just afraid of a strong woman.” *Attempt at using positive punishment by disagreeing with you while using a metaphor implicate a supposed expression of frustration.*

You: “I’m only hiring Chinese midgets, sorry.” *Stating a fact and disagreeing.*

Feminist: “No, it’s sexism. This is how women are oppressed by your way of thinking.” *She gets angry, signaling that she is losing the ability to rationally project herself.*

You: "I can think however I want to."

Feminist: "You won't hire me for position Y because I am a woman. Even your manner of speech is oppressive, because you say so in a way that you do not take seriously." *She feels oppressed every time someone does not give her something for nothing. She also has a weak mind because someone else's voice is stronger than her internal voice, which is why she takes what you said personally.*

You: "Do you know what a spoiled, screaming child sounds like? Yeah, that's you... get out." *Using negative reinforcement by metaphor to help illustrate the abstraction. As a side note, oppression involves force, no force has been used.*

Feminist: "You are being forceful. I am going to sue you for discrimination." *Learn from other people's mistakes. Do not make the costs of your existence higher than what it costs to get rid of you.*

You: "Since you want to violate my property rights I will have security remove you off the premise. That ma'am is an appropriate use of force." *Unfortunately you will then have to deal with a population that does not understand that morality ought to be derived by logic and reasoning, such as knowing that a man's property is an extension of himself.*

Chapter three

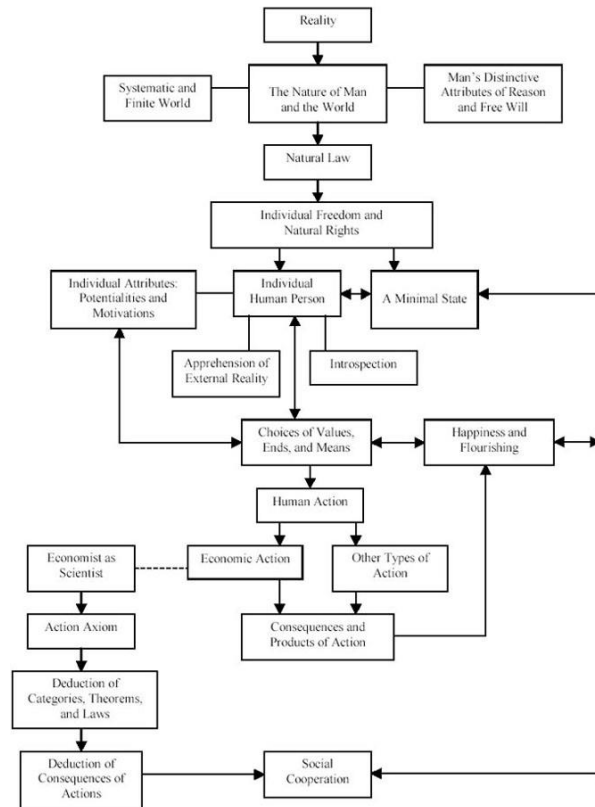
Basis for relationships

Your life would be very tough and short if you had no contact with other human beings²⁶. That is because socialization provides the basis of specialization. You go to the grocery store because you are willing to exchange currency for food. The grocery store would be glad to take your currency, and you would be glad to take apples in exchange. Both you and those who work in the store are both customers and sellers of value; both employer and employee simultaneously. The value of the currency and apple incentivized the transaction. You cannot survive psychologically or physically without being productive; it is the only way you can advance yourself.

Being valuable

1. Visualize exactly what you want and what kind of a project you need to do in the most detail you can

think of. Start a journal and visualize what you like to think about. What do you enjoy focusing on?

2. Writing the steps you need to take acts as an analog for planned action; again the more detailed the better until each step is written into a directive for action. When planning, you should think about the end goal first, then plan backwards.



3. Write down what you expect the outcome to be.

4. Act.

A person's potential for success is in proportion to the extent of failure he or she has experienced. That is because typically there is a relationship between payoff and cost. Success without the potential for failure is impossible. Risks



are unavoidable.

Consistency is an important key to success. Once you see results, you will become confident. Productivity can take many forms, from growing onions to building rockets for space travel. It can also include selling information or proving some kind of service. All abstract wealth is generated by

consciousness. The independent use of your own mind, productively and honestly, is the originator of all wealth.

Self-expression

Expressing yourself takes practice. Such practice goes through essentially four stages:

- First one acts while not fully aware of how something works.
- Second, one begins to question how something works and realizes there is room for improvement.
- Third, gets mastered with practice, but consciousness still hinders the expression.
- Finally, mastered expression is done unconsciously.



The goal is you want to express yourself honestly without having to be conscious of you doing so.

If done competently, undeveloped people will get emotional in your presence, while rational people may attribute value to you.

Your person is conveyed to others whenever you express the experiences you go through. The better you're able to relate those experiences—through the use of analogies, body language, facial expressions, voice inflection, physical or financial health, and a rational arrangement of words and ideas—the more easily value is communicated to others.

Expressing control over the environment is the basis of other individuals respecting you, and expressing yourself in a way that communicates values that allows others to control their environment is the basis of other individuals valuing you. Attributing status to someone is an application of value. What those values are and how you express them determines how people will value you.

Each person has a range of values that vary in acceptability. For this reason, any one person will not rationalize your actions the same way you do. As mentioned before, a person's life is the standard of their values; this is why you cannot know what is offensive to another individual unless you have some conceptual understanding of that person.



The more satisfied a person is, the less that person feels like they need you. Assuming all else equal, the more friends you have and the more people you know in general, the less dependent you are on any one person. Without differentiating yourself, being an additional unit of their friends circle means being less valuable to that person.

Social interaction explained logically

You seek the value of others based on what information you have of them, that is, their perceived value. Whether you gain a value from someone depends on the

degree of relatability. If you live far away from someone that you do not know, then the possibility of gaining a value from that person is low.

Maintenance on any relationship requires investment, such as the costs to your time in order to communicate. The more time you invest, the longer you expect that relationship to last. This is an application of durability; the more established the relationship is, the more durable it is. After all, you would not disvalue your grandmother because she is a bad driver.

People have differing relationships to you because they have differing values. If you express a trait that is of a disvalue to a person, he will perceive you as partially destructive to him. This same destructive trait may be a productive trait to you, such as eating nutritious food that he is allergic to. An architect will place some value on you if you sell him the tools he needs to be an architect.

People are attracted to contextual order, which is determined individually or by external authorities. If you are an architect, you are attracted to the tools of architecture. If you are a marine biologist, you are attracted to the tools of the marine biology. If you are a hoodlum however, your definition of value has probably been determined by external authority. An architect is most likely more individualized than a hoodlum.



If you wanted to build an airport, you may place more value on a person because he is a better architect than your longtime acquaintance. That is because the architect is more valuable to you in the context of building something.

The more you determine yourself, the more valuable and more competitive you will become to others. Alternatively, the more you are determined from external influences, such as an authority figure, then you will produce less and be less competitive. This is because no other person can determine what is ultimately good for you except you; you live in his own context.

Competition incentives competence whereas lack of competition makes way for decay. If you do not perform to the best of your abilities and if you don't differentiate yourself, you should expect to be replaced by your competitors. This is true for every area of your life. There are certain barriers to competition, such as



situations where few people understand a situation or by having preferred relationships; or by force, such as by government. In areas where there is not enough competition mediocrity abounds.

Competition is never that far behind to justify the loss of discipline. Increasing competition means having to change your operations. The more competitive something is, the less profit margin. If you can get ahead of the competition, you may generate more profit than you could otherwise. You can do this by being the first to penetrate a particular market for example, where you could make large profits until others join that segment of the market thereby increasing the competition and profits are driven toward zero. This is why many large corporations invest in research and development.

Chapter four

How women think

A woman's brain is "shaped" differently than a man's brain. This difference has the effect of causing women to be more sensitive to stimuli²⁷²⁸. This combines with the fact that many women are not fully conscious, it is then easier for a woman to be affected more by stimuli. That is why some women can become anorexic or feel

chronically insecure and wishes to have “status” over other people or test men in their relationships.

You may come across gurus on the internet teaching you “advanced” methods of social skills. This advice comes in the form of using some techniques that range anywhere from touching strangers to pick up lines to projecting some authority. All of this of course is the attempt to express value to others while misidentifying the essence of value, and most of it is complete garbage.

Do not adopt to the traits of those you seek. Nineteenth century writer Ralph Waldo Emerson stated that imitation is suicide²⁹. Women for example are desired for agreeableness, but men adopt this, etc. You do not get good advice from someone who cannot sympathize with your position. That is why men often do not give good advice for women to get men, and why women do not give good advice for men to get women. Women for example will advise men to be agreeable, because that works for women, but it does not work for men. It is not unusual for those men who have problems with women are domesticated in their non-minds by women.

The first thing you have to realize is that women on average are no nicer than men on average. Why would they be? Women are not nicer than men. They are self-centered and can be as rational as men.

“Envy is ignorance, Imitation is Suicide.” Is a well-known quote from Ralph Waldo Emerson in his book “Self-Reliance.”

Women are often conditioned to think altruism is bravery, it is not. While men are conditioned to think women respect altruism, but they do not. In saving a woman's cat from a burning house, she will care more about her cat than the fact you saved it. Men have been conditioned to seek female praise, women conditioned to emphasize their physical sexuality, etc³⁰. There are many people who lack a connection to reality. This is why re-engineering your life to satisfy other people will backfire.



Respect is everything in any kind of relationship. A girl may waste your time in order to test your boundaries and will make excuses for it, just to test you. The solution to this is to not buy into her excuses but to continue on by respecting your own time. If she was really into you she will make it up to you anyway, if not, you did not lose anything. If you let a girl cross your boundaries without you respecting them, she will not respect you.

A girl will respect a man who looks at her sexually, while she will not respect someone who looks at her in awe. A less respected way of expressing yourself around young women is doing things that are reactive and show a loss of control. Supplicating to her indicates that you are of lower value to her, and acting emotional and attached indicates lower testosterone levels.

The easiest way to get a girl who lacks impulse control to like you is to have other girls like you. A good woman really likes men who work hard and are truly successful.

Because it is impossible to know important information about someone, people will judge first impressions and how you carry yourself as a means of not wasting their time.

A man with resources is attractive for women because children are the property goods produced in the household factory. Your current resources, the ability to create resources, the ability to protect these resources, and the ability to use these resources effectively (which is the basis of a good "personality") are all determinants of what women find attractive in men.

Like all emotions, love is selfish, and it signifies the approximation to the willingness to invest in an intangible asset to a high degree. Because of this dynamic, when a woman makes more money relative to a man, she does not value him as much because for her the exchange is not as important. Therefore having children in this case are relatively expensive for her because the female aspect is made scarce. Similarly, events such as war can cause men to be scarce to women³¹.

What is confidence?

Confidence is contextual certainty. Whoever has the most unwavering certainty and the least emotional reaction towards conflicting views, will tend to have the most dominant sense of reality. Characteristics of confidence are having the patience in controlling your

eagerness, having a sense of humor, and judging others to whether or not they live up to your standards.

Unconfident people have to justify themselves, feel cranky, jealous, or anxious, preoccupied by other people, and falls into dependency. If you have nothing to offer someone, going out of your way to contact that person expresses dependency.

As a man masters controlling the environment, he becomes attractive to women, especially to those who specifically value the type of control that he has individually cultivated. As a woman masters controlling herself, she is more attractive to men, especially to those men who value her form of her own self-control and is receptive to his environmental control.

How to get women to like you:

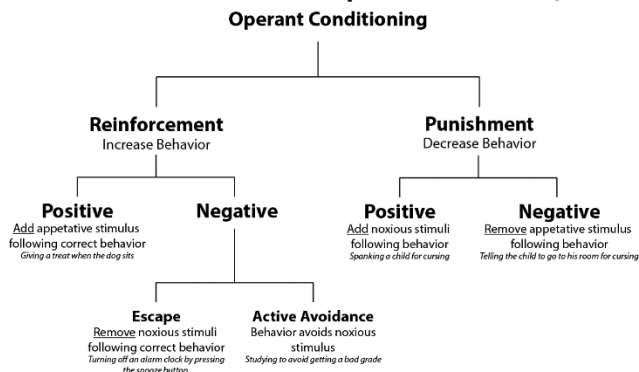
1. Have a purpose in life. Attempt to be the very best at what you do and you will move up in "status." At minimum you will be respected.
2. Develop independence and do not waver to any kind of manipulation games. Caving in to the whims of anyone is a signals that you are undeveloped.
3. Express yourself as your own authority. This will have the effect of expressing value to her developed self and being god-like to her undeveloped self. You will be an external authority to undeveloped women.
4. Get into the best physical shape you can get into. This expresses that you are good at managing your resources. It will also boost your testosterone levels,

which enhances your competitive drive³². Both results are attractive to women, to varying degrees.

Examples of each of the steps:

Examples of step one:

- Woman rejects some bum. What would she have anything to do with him?
- Woman rejects a successful man that she is not compatible with. If she is not compatible with his personality, then values will probably not get communicated very well, defeating the purpose of the relationship. Although she respects him, it is not going to work out.

Examples of step two:

Example one³³:

Girl complains about the cloths you are wearing:

Girl: "We are not going out with you looking like that."

1. You: *You submit to her: "okay fine, I will change..." perhaps she can spoon feed you too.*
2. You: "Come on, let's go anyway!" *Even though she will not like the way you dress, she will respect you more this way. Respect is essential in relationships.*

Example two:

Girl does not like the car you are driving:

You: "Do you want to buy me a new one?" *You show that you respect yourself as you are living on your own terms.*



Girl: "I just think you should do better for yourself."

You: "If I am not good enough for you, then leave me, right now!" *Do not worry about why she wants you to drive a different vehicle (maybe because she feels embarrassed riding in a depreciated car), just continue to respect your time and energy,*

Example three:

Girl: "Do I look fat in these cloths." *She is looking for you to re-affirm her.*

You: *You go straight to the point:* "Do I need to re-affirm you? I think you look better in these cloths, etc." *She is either testing you or she is expressing her weakness.*

Girl: "You did not answer my question."

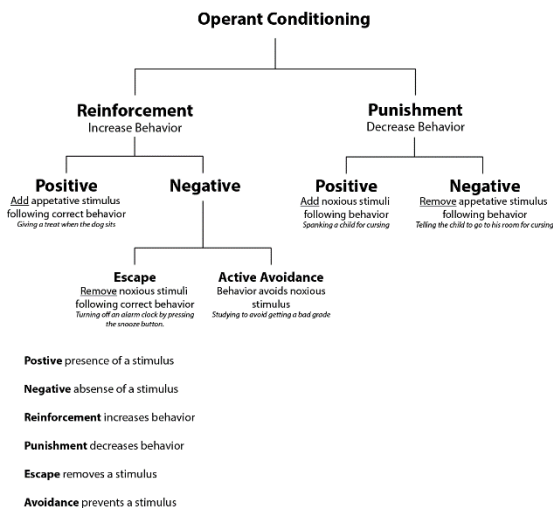
You: "Because it is a stupid question, you look fine."

Girl: "You are just saying that."

You: "Here, do I look fat in this?"

Girl: "No"

You: "I think you are just saying that..."



Example four³⁴:

Girl cancels a date at the last minute to do something with her friends. *This shows she does not respect you.*

You: "Did you plan on doing something with your friends?"

Girl: "No."

You: "If you are going cancel, don't do it last minute. You are an adult, you know better. What's wrong with you?" *Positive punishment and expression of self-respect.*

Girl: "Nothing." *Positive punishment by disagreeing.*

You: "No, something is wrong with you..." *Positive punishment by disagreeing and not making any concessions to your time and energy.*

Girl: "Nothing is wrong with me, just because I decide to spend time with my best friends instead of you. Why are you so selfish?" *She is flaunting disrespect towards you. Do not express frustration.*

You: "I'm playing games with you. Either you respect my time or you won't get any of my time." *This is a good test to whether or not she really likes you. If she does not respect you, she will not like you anyway. Be straightforward but **do not express frustration**. Expressing frustration means she has control over you.*

You do something and she gives you the silent treatment. You go to talk to her and she does not want to talk to you.

You: *Go about your way and ignore her silent treatment. This is a good test of your personal independence. Let her start talking before you do. Expect a clear explanation for the silent treatment, if there is no good reason for it, expect an apology. **Do not express frustration.***

The point to all of these examples is not to give into any kind of irrationality. Your mind is an important asset so

you should never sanction any kind irrationality, as it is a diversion from reality.

Examples of step three:

Interaction with a rational woman:

You: *You are in a library and a cute librarian walks by you. You walk by her, smile and make and maintain eye contact because she is cute. You should have a little fun doing this, if not, you are doing it wrong. Looking into her eyes shows that you are not inhibited.*

Her: *She smiles back and blushes. She is having fun too. A rational woman is not inhibited.*

You: "Gosh you even look like you work here..."

Her: "What does that supposed to mean?"

You: "It means that you are a cute librarian"

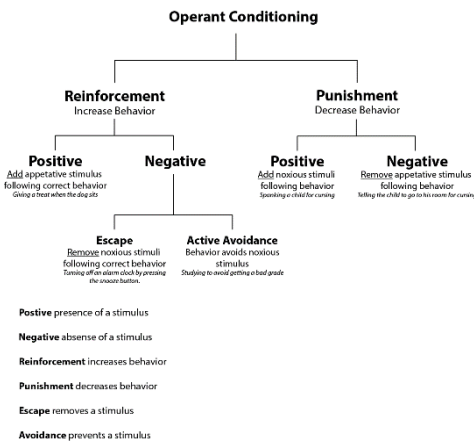
Her: "Oh stop it." *She smiles. She is playing along because it is fun and different from whatever monotonous stuff she does.*

You: "What kind of books do you like to read?"

Her: "Blablabla kind of books"

You: "Well, I know something about blablabla... Let's go hang out at the coffee shop sometime."

Her: "Sure, here is my number."



Interaction with an irrational woman³⁵:

If she is not controlling herself, she is being controlled by something. Therefore your focus drives the outcome. As an external authority on a woman, you keep that pose by maintaining a dominant composure.

You: You are in a library and a cute librarian walks by you. You walk by her, smile and make and maintain eye contact because she is cute. This has the effect of maintaining a dominate composure. As you are much less inhibited than she is.

Her: She smiles back and blushes. She is having fun too, but she also feels that you are the authority over her for holding eye contact, initiating the conversation, and maintaining a non-impulsive demeanor. Since she is not developed enough herself, she thinks you can potentially magically solve her problems since you seem more powerful than she is.

You: "Gosh you even look like you work here..."

Her: "What does that supposed to mean?"

You: "It means that you are a cute librarian"

Her: "Oh stop it." *She smiles. She is justifying herself by flirting back. Since she is not developed enough, all of this is accepted as operant conditioning applied to herself; in this case, my attention is rewarded to her (positive reinforcement).*

You: "What kind of books do you like to read?"

Her: "Blablabla kind of books"

You: "Well, I know something about blablabla... Let's go hang out at the coffee shop sometime."

Her: "Sure, here is my number."

Since you are focused on an outcome, an undeveloped girl will be led into that outcome. A developed girl may or may not go along with the focused outcome. Your operant conditioning is the driving mechanism for your focus.

Interaction with a rational woman:

Her: "What are you doing?"

You: "Working on project X like I said I was going to do two weeks ago."

Her: "Oh, sorry, I forgot. I was thinking today was Monday, gosh I'm so tired. Make that go well!"

You: "I know what I am doing. I'll see you in a couple of hours."

Interacting with an irrational woman:

Her: "What are you doing?"

You: "Working on project X like I said I was going to do two weeks ago."

Girl: "Why can't spend time with me?"

You: "Stop whining. You are just going to have to wait for a couple of hours." *After this, you ignore her until you are finish with project X.*

Lack of self-respect means being inhibited. Being inhibited means that you cannot focus properly.

Examples of step four:

- You weigh 200 pounds, with less than 15% body fat. Women like to flirt with you because you work hard at keeping yourself in shape. This shows good character. *Of course this means nothing if no other value to back yourself up with.*

- Maybe you are not quite like the above, but you are working hard on important projects and independent minded to carry them out. You are not out of shape, you have a lot of energy. Maybe this character is not expressed readily, but it exists. *Getting in shape takes time, if you are busy, then you are deferring that work later.*
- You are completely out of shape. You have a habit of letting important assets deteriorate. No wonder why girls do not like you. How resourceful can you be if your health costs go through the roof? *One of your long term goals should be getting in shape.*

If you need to be told what to do on a date, then you that you lack experience with women, and probably people in general. If this is true, then you are in no position to rush anything. There is nothing wrong with rejection, in fact be prepared for it. Focus on having fun and do not take anything seriously. Going out with a group of friends might be the best thing to do. If you do not have a group of friends to hang out with, work on that first.

Chapter five

Advice for single women

On self-control

Like stated before, you have to think and act independently, that means having a purpose in life. People notice this when you express better moods as you are self-improving. Reacting to external authority such as a celebrity, is childish. You will experience emotions in a serious relationship, but again, your emotions do not identify reality so this is not a reason for you to lose yourself. You are much more attractive when you control yourself.

Physical health

It is easier for you to stay in shape than it is to have to get into good shape. If you cannot maintain your health, what makes you think you are going to maintain a relationship? The older you get, the more important your health becomes as there is less you may take for granted. A women is at her peak in terms of attractiveness and fertility when she is in young adulthood³⁶³⁷ and then declines as she ages. Physical attractiveness is the expression of good health, so do not take your health for granted.

When you do not live up to your purpose and live in a state of disorder, not only do you have less self-control and therefore lack individuality, but also make yourself less valuable because you are more costly to other individuals to deal with you. The key here is self-control, which is the feminine sphere. You should always clean your personal surroundings. Clean yourself up physically, do not make it look like you are unhealthy or aging prematurely.

Being approachable

The less self-control you have, the less appealing you will be. You will see women get tattoos for example, but in doing so, those women had contracted their potential network and rendered themselves less competitive. A woman with visible tattoos will be less likely to be hired for a skilled job than a woman that does not have visible tattoos, all else equal. That is because men respect women that express self-control.

Because of social dynamics, men are not going to approach you in a high risk situation; they will not approach women who they think have boyfriends, or in a location that is known for fights breaking out, etc. How you dress depends on what kind of attention you want. Always dress at least somewhat intelligently.

The dynamics of attraction in relationships

After getting to know one another, it is more likely that you will change how you feel about a man than a man is going to change how he is attracted to you. This is

because you already express what is important to him early on, your fertility and self-control. In the time ahead he will be judging the compatibility of the relationship. In other words, your attractiveness usually does not increase as he is getting to know you. How a woman is attracted to a man is totally different however. The traits that you find attractive do not show up until you get to know the man. Sure, you are attracted to the level of testosterone that he expresses, or a "status" disposition he has, but traits of both self-control and controlling his environment do not show up right away (which is the reason why women look for the characteristic traits, as they have nothing else to go on right away, and why "authority" and other "seduction" works to varying degrees). You need to see a man act on a challenging situation to really know what he is.

The more exclusive the relationship, the more investment on his part, the higher his standards will be on you. The more you want from a long term relationship, the higher standards you ought to put onto yourself in preparation for it.

Defining a good relationship

Relationships are asset that get tested for durability over time, although the attraction might be there right away. If either individual is not happy with the relationship over time, or if there is a lack of honesty, or a net loss of value over time, then stop wasting your time and patience and move on.

As previously stated, exclusivity in a relationship requires more investment from the man. Think about this in terms of moving on a scale. The more you ask for in return of any feminine value you have to offer, the less "man" you get. So, say you get older, and therefore you have less to offer in terms of fertility, the less you can get from any man. This again is like a market, where people buy and sell commodities and the pricing mechanism is a signal to identify value and clear markets. Whatever price you clear the market is the value that you communicate to others that you are worth. If you are communicating a price higher than what you are clearing the market with, then there is a problem with communication with either you or other people.

There are three things you need to do in order to earn a good long term relationship. Those characteristics are: be as valuable as you can possibly be in accordance to your purpose, express yourself honestly with the goal of acquiring the largest friend circle you may have the energy to maintain, and lay explicit standards of what boundaries you expect the people around you to follow without violating anyone.

If you want to maintain the relationship with the man, then support him, be exclusive to him, maintain honesty and thus trust, respect him, and do not try to control him.

Men will not make commitments that they are not incentivized to make. Decide if your investment of a relationship is worth your time. There may be situations

where if the guy does not comment to you, then you are better off searching again rather than to waste your time with such a guy. This book is not going to tell you what to do, but there are some suggestions it will make.

How to respond to idiots hitting on you

Do not assume that a person will conceptualize anything but clear communication. In the chance that the person is weak, using a punishment as an operant conditioner will typically work. As discussed earlier, you don't react to anyone, so you continue to do as you would regardless of the guy. In most cases, simply telling him that you are not interested is sufficient.

Ways to lack self-control

- Initiating contact with men more often than rarely.
- Giving into sex easily.
- Changing relationships quickly.
- Getting into relationships with married men.
- Acting like a man.

Do not act like a man

If you act like a man (evaluating yourself on the masculine dynamic, drinking too much alcohol, not caring how you dress, etc.) and expect people to treat you with the same benefits of a man, you will be disappointed, not to mention you will be expressing yourself in such a way that is not attractive to men. This is not to say that you should not control your environment, it is just that men

are attracted to the feminine traits in women as much as women are attracted to the masculine traits in men. Intelligence, productiveness, etc. is not as attractive in women as it is in men. This is not to say that you can be lazy and act stupid.

On modern feminism

Authorities have created modern feminism by using emotions to identify reality and claiming that women are default victims. Modern feminists attempt to eliminate external authority while not cultivating internal authority. You have to develop your consciousness first in order to be able to forget about external authority. You cannot claim victimhood while demonstrating a lack of impulse control yourself; you will not be taken seriously.

Women have also been encouraged to develop masculine characteristics and to take on masculine careers. Some of these have only been made possible to women lowering the entry standards. Some jobs that require a threshold of physical strength have lowered requirements for women, causing dislocations as a result of government intervention. Women have an unnatural advantage in countries where there is this kind of intervention.

When a person is subsidized, they are not willing to produce as many values because they are effectively pacified. Feminism promotes government intervention for women in the name of equality³⁸. Laws mandate

'equality,'³⁹ despite being applied to private property. Just like how welfare distorts the sought after wage for the unemployed, women's expectations of relationships are also distorted while she is on welfare. Government intervention distorts relationships.

The promotion of the idea of a gender pay gap and the rationalization of false rape allegations are just two examples of how the established media promotes the ideology of a radicalized version of feminism⁴⁰. When you look at the actual data, you will see there is no such thing as the gender pay gap. Yet those in academia⁴¹ and mainstream media⁴²⁴³ who promoted this notion believe in equality of outcome over opportunity. Women are less likely to work full time, are less likely to work in a dangerous capacity, and are less likely to do heavier work than men do. Women are also less likely to be entrepreneurs, although there are some fantastic exceptions, such as Martha Stewart.

Sexual exploration is one of the reasons why men are less likely to comment to relationships. Men will have sex with the least amount of effort if that path exists.

Just like women will do the same for resources, many of them will acquire them with as little effort as possible. One of the reasons why the rate of marriage has decline in the last 20 years and the average age has increased to the late 20's (up from early 20's) is that women have been encouraged to have sex casually⁴⁴. If you are really smart, you will wait as long as he is absolutely willing to wait before you have sex. This will allow you to maximize the value of the relationship because it allows you to channel that sexual energy productively.

Many feminists have also attacked men in general over issues of entitlement and commitment. Men actually do not have commitment problems. You must recognize that no man has an obligation to you.

Chapter Six

Introduction to economics

Labor

Earlier you have read that individuals operate on their own self-interests - to the extent that they can separate themselves from the rest of their environment. People need values in order to survive and thrive. Specialization allows one to add more value to something that is already of value for someone else. So, naturally, human

beings seek commerce. Indeed, markets are a function of human behavior. Because each individual seeks some kind of equilibrium, a whole equilibrium is always the outcome. Hopefully you of course are an input to the labor force. How rational you determines how productive you are.

Capital

Large efforts resulting in small results is a definition of poverty, while small efforts resulting in large results is a



definition of wealth. Capital is anything that is leveraged to replace labor. This could be anything from a hammer to a supercomputer, from a bicycle to an armored tank. Like anything else, it is subject to the dynamics of supply and demand. A lack of capital can

only be substituted by labor. When you lack capital, you have to work harder to produce the same results as with a person that has the mechanism to make the task easier.

Business activity

Competition drives individuals, and thus institutions to offer the widest array of services efficiently. Individuals have to “manage” either less conscious individuals



or deal with the ‘principle agent problem⁴⁵.’ For individuals who are even more invested in the particular business, opportunity costs⁴⁶ and opportunities to capture markets must be recognized. Timing in action, research and development⁴⁷, anticipating competition⁴⁸. Individuals also need to acquire information is a value, otherwise ignorance drives out higher quality and destroys expectations.

Taxes and regulation hinder business activity. Capital gains tax reduces the incentive for investment for example, or consider that the tax code subsidizes the banks because interest expense can be written off. Governments can also create market power by limiting entry.

Government

When you are subject to initial force or fraud, your own conscious capacity is being undermined; you are less capable of producing value. Thus it follows that countries whose government does not recognize individual sovereignty are also the poorest⁴⁹.

The economic role of government is to provide a protection service to raise the cost of the initial use of force and fraud. The more effective that system is, the more investment can take place without common criminals intervening. Governments also need to establish a well-defined set of property rights since property is an extension of its owner to use or dispose of it as the individual sees fit. What are property rights?

1. The right to use the good
2. The right to earn income from the good
3. The right to transfer the good to others
4. The right to enforcement of property rights.

Government is force by definition. It does not have a competitive productive capacity by virtue of being a monopoly of force. Governments transfer values by a combination of direct and indirect taxation and monetary debasement. Direct taxation is like the income tax. Indirect taxation is voluntary, like a sales tax. Taxation is responsible for misallocating resources. It is taking

value while distorting the price mechanism away from individual choices.

Regulations are a cost to individuals. People already have an incentive to regulate themselves in order to keep their reputations. Regulations increase the cost of doing business. Think minimum wage laws, they increase unemployment by instituting a price floor for labor.

The danger in politics

Those who promote regulation either do not understand the problem at hand or assume that people are essentially animals. Authoritarianism asserts danger from others, and justifies the regulation. When government gets involved in every aspect of daily life, those aspects of life become politicized.

Introduction to banking

Banks originated as goldsmiths issuing receipts for gold. Their profits depended on how effective they worked as a service, both scale and scope. Banks competed with each other for market share, so they offered incentives to their customers and provided other services.

Banks began using fractional reserve practices and leveraging risk by selling loans. Banks made more money by essentially transferring money and risk between savers and investors. When there is an increase in business activity, there is also an increase in

borrowing. Interest rates served as the price for borrowing. The more risk, the higher the interest rate⁵⁰. Interest also serves as a reward for saving; the amount depended on the supply and demand for money.

The function of interest rates

Interest rates serve as the price for borrowing money. Assuming that there is no central bank, when people saved, there was more money that could be lent out, and thus a bank could charge a lower rate of interest on the loans that it made assuming some level of risk⁵¹. For this reason, banks seek to attract depositors to their safekeeping and financial service business. Banks advertise, establish good locations, etc. However, with the introduction of fiat currency, interest rates change depending on how much currency is created by either the government or the central bank. The value of either the money or currency held in the banking system determines the total supply of loanable funds.

The demand for loans depends on the interest rate and whatever derived demand an individual has. The lower the interest rate, the cheaper the loan, the larger the consumer base, the higher demand for loans, and an increase in savings and investment increases the supply of loans. It is important to note that government may borrow so much, that it consumes a higher proportion of

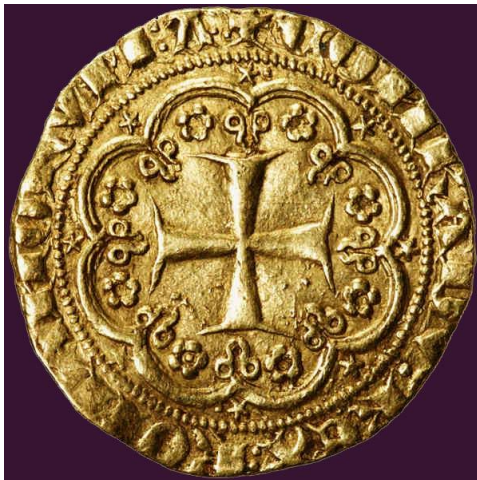

the savings supply, thus naturally raising interest rates. This is called the crowding out effect.

Barter

As people became more specialized, and a coincidence of wants was unlikely, money came into use as a representation and store of value. Barter was done in commodities, and then money first began with smaller, divisible commodities such as bronze, copper, or salt. Over time money evolved into gold and silver. The problem was that people learned how to mint coins that looked like gold and silver. It is the reason why traditionally people would bite a coin to test its malleability; silver, and especially gold, could easily bend. Later, rulers learned how to debase money by shaving the outside of coins to usurp the content of the gold or silver away from the coin. This is the origin of government induced inflation and the reason why coins



have traditionally had ridges around the outer edge. If they had ridges, then people would know that the coin had not been shaved and thus is worth its full face value⁵².

Banking evolved first as a service to store people's money as goldsmiths. When people did this, the bank or goldsmith would issue a receipt for the

person's gold or silver⁵³. These receipts turned into the paper money you see today. These receipts were redeemable in whatever they were backed by on demand. The above ten dollar note was redeemable in half an ounce of gold.

Fiat Currency

Governments issued currency during wartime; they had to out finance whom they were at war with.

Governments would continue to issue this fiat currency, which was supposed to have the same value as gold receipts, but the

government would issue too many of these until people recognized that they were not worth the paper they were printed on. The issuance of paper currency and the use of commodity money continued until modern times.

However, the public education system and a post WWII entertainment industry conditioned people from recognizing the value of commodities as money.

Fiat currency works best when it is issued by central banks that are mostly independent from government. Governments have the incentive to debase currency too fast. The nature of central banking however means that they have some relationship with government. They cannot exist without government granting them the monopoly to issue that country's currency.



Regulations by the government and the central bank

Reserve requirements, capital requirements & asset restrictions⁵⁴, bank examinations⁵⁵, and deposit insurance⁵⁶ are the broad regulations banks comply with. The Central bank acts as a lender of last resort and can

even bailout troubled institutions during a financial panic. These banking safeguards create a moral hazard by incentivizing banks to leverage even more risk. Since banks compete with each other as in any

other business, they need to generate more revenue than their competitors. Otherwise that business gets competed out of existence.

Banks now have the incentive to act in ways that they would not have. The central bank for example will expand their balance sheet to drive down the price of loans that banks would have loaned to each other, indicating that there is more savings in the financial system than there really is. Banks end up selling riskier loans than they would have otherwise because this price mechanism is distorted and the moral hazard of some government backing. The other hazard created by regulation is the incentive to act to avoid the regulation itself. The result are "shadow banks" that are able to operate outside of regulation; these are financial institutions that do not carry deposits, but are owned by banks who do own deposits. It is worthy to also note that the United States tax code subsidizes the banks because interest expense can be written off.

What is the Central bank?

The central bank in the United States is called the Federal Reserve Bank (often shorted to "fed"), it was establish by the Federal Reserve Act that passed on December 1913. The fed has 12 member banks distributed through the country, and is the bank that supplies credit to the government and commercial banks.

The Federal Reserve Act delegates “authority” to the central bank by congress. The justification is to provide stability and flexibility in monetary policy. Fiat currency is ‘faith money.’ The Federal Reserve acts as an external authority in that it conducts monetary policy by controlling the nation’s currency supply.

The political machine does not have direct access to the central bank, otherwise it politicians could increase the currency supply on their own account, creating substantial monetary inflation. Instead, the president appoints the Federal Reserve chairman and the Fed technically operates independent of politics.



Officially, it conducts monetary policy for “full employment and stable prices,” provides financial services to the United States government, and supervises banks and the overall financial system in order to maintain creditability in the system. However the Federal Reserve Bank is a private bank⁵⁷. While the Fed serves as the bank for the United States government, United States Treasury manages the nation’s finances.

The purpose of the central bank is to control the financial system. They do this by expanding their balance sheet

(creating currency). The fed has three normal policy instruments. They are open market operations, reserve requirements, and the discount rate.

Monetary policy instruments:

Open market operations

A central bank can control any interest rate that it sees fit. The Federal Reserve can control the rate of interest on mortgage backed securities for example, as it did after the 2008 housing bubble burst. The Fed typically controls the federal funds rate, which is the rate in which banks make loans to each other in order to satisfy their reserve requirements⁵⁸ or be able to honor deposits or to enable them to make loans. The Fed controls the federal funds rate by buying or selling treasuries. If the fed bought treasuries, it increases the supply of money, decreases the supply of treasuries, increases the price of treasuries, and causes the federal funds rate to decrease. If the fed sells treasuries, that action will decrease the supply of money, increase the supply of treasuries, lower the price of treasuries, and thus causes the federal funds rate to increase. This mechanism is how the Federal Reserve maintains a target rate of interest in the financial system, and serves as a key indicator of economic activity.

Reserve requirements

How much currency a commercial bank must hold as a percentage of deposits. In the United States, this is set at ten percent. Some countries do not have reserve requirements for their banks. "Shadow banks," that is banks who operate as investment institutions that do not keep deposits, and therefore not as regulated.

Currency is created by a process called fractional reserve banking. A person borrows currency from a commercial bank, that currency is created as a deposit. The newly

created deposit is a liability to the bank, whereas the loan that pays interest to the bank, is an asset. When a borrower pays back a loan, currency disappears from the balance



sheet; including the interest that was also paid to the bank. In the United States, this continues as long as the bank keeps a certain reserve requirement, currently set at ten percent. Some countries do not mandate reserve requirements for banks.

Fractional reserve banking allows the banking system to multiply the monetary direction the central bank as set through a ratio of how much currency can create currency⁵⁹. In order to keep this system going, new

money has to be created faster than being destroyed by people paying off debts or banks writing off bad loans (debt deleveraging). When debt is deleveraged, currency supply contracts at a faster rate, called monetary deflation.

Table briefly describing relation to interest rates for commercial banks:

Discount rate	Rate higher than fed's fund rate	For emergencies only, must be backed by collateral.
Target federal funds rate	What the fed targets	
Deposit rate	Rate lower than funds fund rate	Rate for deposits at the fed.

Discount loans are an asset to the Federal Reserve, however banks that do borrow from the Fed are screened carefully as a healthy bank and or financial system should not borrow money from the "lender of last resort." If the bank is sound enough, then these loans can be made at the discount rate (called primary credit); if the bank is less sound, then these loans are made at a higher rate of interest (secondary credit).

The balance sheet of the central bank:

Assets	Liabilities
Securities	Currency

loans	Deposits of commercial banks

Unlike securities such as United States Treasuries, currency itself does not pay interest. Currency in deposit at the Federal Reserve actually pays interest to its depositors, making this currency a liability⁶⁰.

Only a central bank can expand its balance sheet at will. Business balance sheets expand when profits are retained by operation and capital is acquired, or when money is borrowed. A central bank expands its balance sheet when it issues new currency to either buy government bonds from the Treasury or monetize other assets, such as the case in quantitative easing (buying government bonds from banks).

This type of accounting allows the central bank to literally change the size of its balance sheet. In practice, this balance sheet expands with the central bank's actions. The conventional monetary policy instruments influence the rate of expansion.

The Federal Reserve Bank sells Treasury securities and deposits the money as the government's account. What the Federal Reserve holds in securities it earns interest.

What the Federal Reserve profits it pays the Treasury. If in the event of a crisis at the Federal Reserve, the Treasury is obligated to bail out the Federal Reserve. The treasury issues these securities. That is how the government borrows money (your taxes are used to pay the interest on this debt, bondholders receive this tax revenue)⁶¹.

What also affects central bank's balance sheet:

- Cash withdraws, discount loans, foreign exchange intervention, and open market operations effect the central bank's balance sheet.
- Cash withdraws by commercial banks decrease Federal Reserve's liabilities
- Discount loans ensure a safety net for commercial banks. These are loaned out at the discount rate, priced above the target federal funds rate.
- Foreign exchange intervention: competitive currency practices. Exporters prefer a cheaper currency relative to other currencies, making what they export relatively cheaper compared to the foreign country's domestic output; this helps to increase exports. If the interest rate rises, currency appreciates and

imports are cheaper and exports are more expensive.

- Open market operations, which has already been explained.

Quantitative easing

If the federal funds rate is already near zero, and the extra liquidity is not enough to entice aggregate demand, the central bank may target other interest rates in order to incentivize banks to make loans at a lower interest rate. The Federal Reserve buys assets to lower interest rates of assets banks would hold when overall risk is too high to make substantial amounts of loans. As a result, banks are more incentivized to make riskier loans, since interest rates on assets are too low.

The Central Bank and the economy as a whole

The underlining ideology of those who work at a central bank is that of Keynesian economics. What is Keynesian economics? A short synopsis is that human beings are inherently not rational and require an external authority to incentivize people economically to curb their “animal spirits,” as Keynes himself called it. Keynes called for government spending tax cuts to spur aggregate demand when prices were not being bided up by a slowing down of economic activity. Many people agree to this because they think wealth is defined as higher asset prices. So if the price of their house decreased, these people think the

government has to do something about it. In fact the decrease in the price is a healthy response to an overinflated market, brought on by easy credit by target interest rates too low for the natural market (that is, the amount of real savings that could be lent out).

So this is what happens: The central bank issues fiat currency to buy government debt which is created by a fiat expansion of the balance sheet at the fed. The fed also lowers the federal funds rate to indicate to banks that rates are low, falsely indicating a larger amount of savings in the financial system than there really is.

Banks lower their interest rates to make loans, while attempting to outdo another out of competition. The level of consumer debt increases so much more than there is enough



savings to cover all of it. With all this extra currency, prices get bided up. This is called price inflation because currency supply is increasing output does not increase enough. Neo-Keynesians think that by increasing the supply of currency that the extra initial demand is enough to increase aggregate output, but instead the what output that does increase is not the output that the market would otherwise dictate. When output in a certain sector increases **only** due to the increase in currency, it is called a bubble. At some point, this bubble

prices itself out of the market, once this happens and the market is saturated (buyers turn into sellers looking to make a profit), speculators get out of the market and the price begins to fall. This is exactly what happened stock prices after 2000 and housing after 2008.

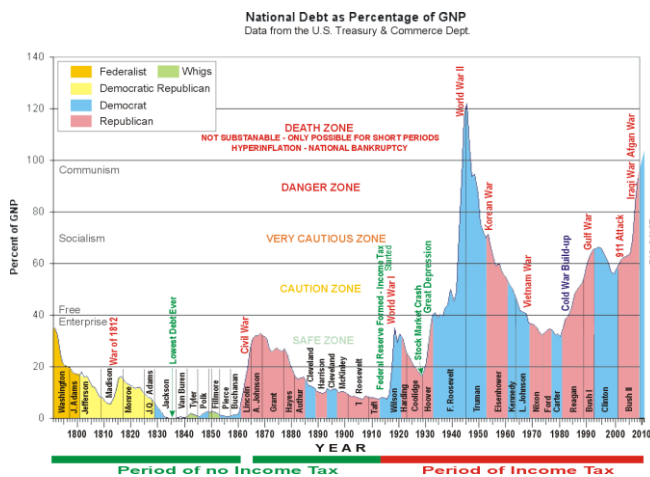
Technically, the central bank changes the interest rate in response to the demand for money and inflation. If inflation is too high, it raises interest rate to stem the amount of currency creation by banks. Alternatively, it can lower interest rates to stem low money velocity (deflation). Again, central bank policy creates these fluctuations, then they react to it later. Proponents of bigger government favor this cycle because it gives them the crisis and thus excuse to expand government to control more than it had before.

Central bankers do not think it is possible that an economy can grow without currency creation; again they think of wealth as higher asset prices. So there is a term called 'aggregate demand for money'. With regard to transactions, in order to hypothetically keep the price level from falling, demand for money increases during uncertainty, or when the economy expands as a result of currency creation. Demand falls when interest rises (opportunity costs), demand rises when income increases as a result of the transaction demand for money. Less money will be held for transactions so money velocity rises (a measure of how many times currency or money exchanges hands). The higher the expected payoffs, the

higher the demand for money for investments. Because real investments tend to be derived, not speculated, so a lower interest rate will not always have an expansionary effect. Low interest rates and high unemployment may not spur investment, since returns on investment may be low.

Inflation in a sense, is the price one pays for the goods and services that is bought with the new, cheaper currency. Currency is like money, but is not a store of value. Money represents a unit of account, store of value, and means of payment. Currency replaces money because of faith and legal tender laws (two pillars of the system: faith and force). The system is accustomed to increasing money supply and faith. If people lost faith in the system, money velocity would rise rapidly. Think about Bitcoin.

Chapter seven



The how the fed is affecting the current economy

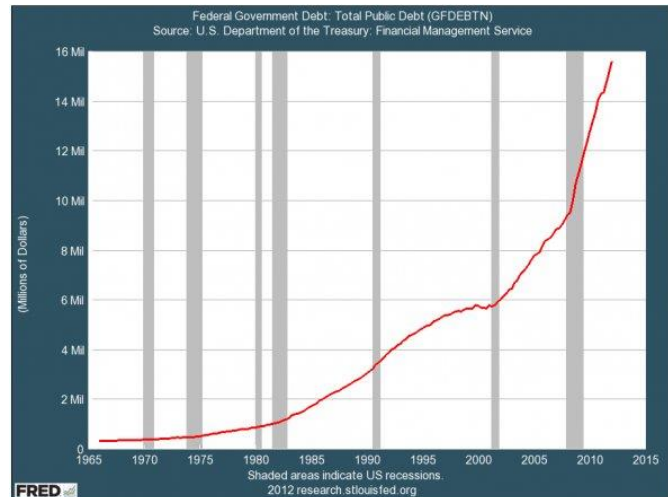
Astronomical debt is the consequence of decades of a populace that expects an outside authority to take

care of them, thinking that government can provide a free lunch. Every country has the same problem; some are in worse condition than others. Massive amounts of debt is facilitated by easy credit via monetary debasement. The consequence of this is theft by inflation.

When a central bank lowers the interest rate, it sends a signal to banks that there is more currency that can be loaned out, so banks also lower their interest rates to remain competitive and attract business. The lower interest rates in turn send signals to those in business that there is more money (as people think it is) that can be borrowed and invested at lower cost, and thus are able to invest in projects that yield lower returns (that also tend to be longer term, more capital intensive projects). The actual savings and spending in the economy would not normally support this, but since interest rates have been targeted lower by the central bank, prices of a certain set of assets (such as stocks or housing) start getting bided up by investors who think such assets are worth investing in.

Due to increasing currency creation and fractional reserve banking, banks continue to create even more currency in their operations. The more currency a bank has deposited, the more loans it can make, and consumer confidence is also bided up by the bubble that unavoidably occurs as a result of the inflation. Because people define wealth as high asset prices, the bubble

economy is favored by many until it collapses when inflated assets get priced out of the market and buying slows down. The Central bank creates these bubbles until the recessions expose the destructive mal-investments. Falling asset prices are actually the solution.



During the correction, assets are deleveraged as investors realize that such undertakings were not profitable as once thought and people go bankrupt. The solution to this is to allow people to make re-adjustments and all prices to fall as it actually stimulates demand because prices move toward equilibrium. Assets would then be cheap enough for people to buy and the market expands at a lower price level. The system of course does not allow prices to go to equilibrium.

The rationale is that the macro economy needs constantly rising prices in order keep with monetary demand. Big governments need to inflate away their debts



and continue borrowing currency because the financial system operates on increasing monetary inflation. Since currency comes into circulation by debt, it is impossible for government to pay the entire debt in this system because the currency is the debt principle plus interest owed. Banks also do not have the liquidity to cover most of their deposits. Without monetary debasement, the whole system would collapse catastrophically. So bubbles are continuously inflated without full correction. This is why central banks lower interest rates when the bubble bursts, they are attempting to re-inflate another class of assets, just to keep the system going.

Why the central bank?

Without the central bank, interest rates go up throughout the economy as government issues large amounts of debt, as much of the savings are being consumed. This is known as the crowding out effect. The central bank exists in part in order to control interest rates. How does it do this when government is borrowing so much? The Federal Reserve in the United States does open market operations, which it buys government bonds called Treasuries (bonds, notes, bills) so the crowding out effect is not noticed by the public. Since so much of the debt is issued by the government, a central bank is most effective at controlling the interest rate by buying government debt (the rationale is that government debt is "risk free"). Without the central bank, governments could not raise debts astronomically. When interest rates

are low, debt is cheaper to issue, including government debt. Bond issuance is at record levels, much like what happens before a major crash.

Every debt ceiling controversy is an admission that the government is involved in a Ponzi scheme, the fact that government must continue to grow larger and larger debts. Public pensions alone are 4.6 trillion short of covering their liabilities⁶².

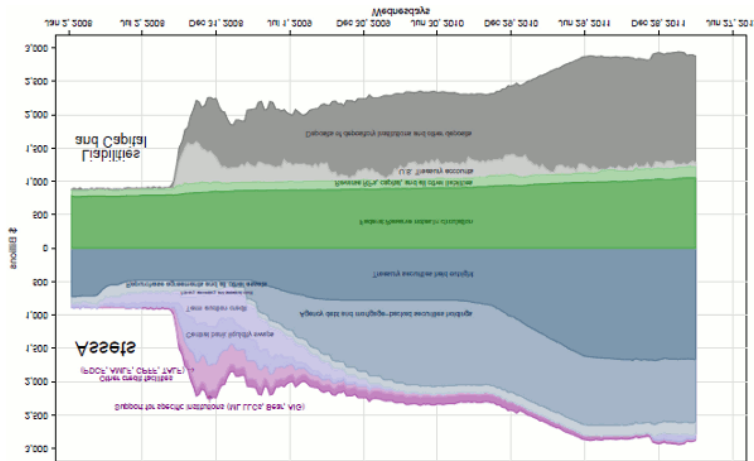


Once this printing press is on, it is impossible politically to turn it off because monetary inflation makes it easier for government to 'keep' with their 'obligatory' handouts (i.e. welfare, military spending, etc.). Obligations that were promised as anything from a return to bond holders of government debt to welfare recipients, is easier for government to pay off with cheaper dollars. This is the reason why retiree's social security does not pay for as much as it once did a decade ago.

Quantitative easing and stocks

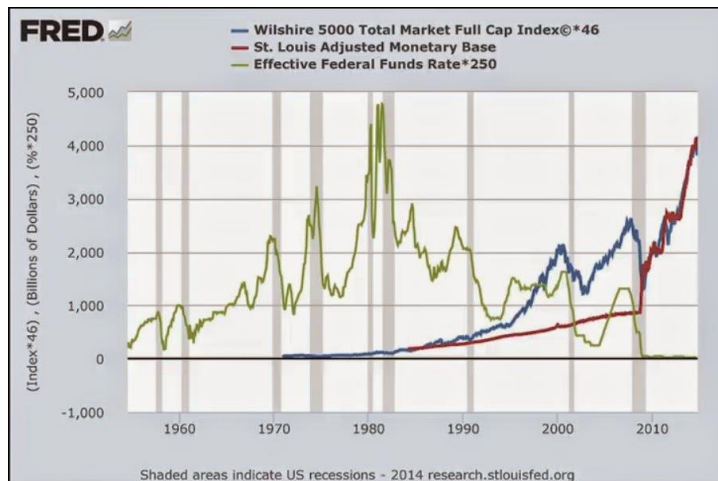

Quantitative easing is when the central bank buys paper assets aggressively to lower interest rates other than the feds fund rate. Most of this was

buying government debt straight from the commercial banks that they would normally keep as income producing assets. Buying these assets was done in order to increase liquidity in bank's reserves. The fed also bought bonds from private corporations, such as General Motors, as a part of the government bailout.



The Wilshire is a composite of weighted index of all publically traded stocks in the U.S⁶³. Normally higher interest rates attract people's savings to be deposited in banks and invested in bonds. The

quantitative easing has pushed rates so low, that people seek stocks for return instead. Corporations now can borrow money at low interest and buy back their own stock in order to look good on their balance sheets.

Since the debt can be written off on their taxes, this is yet another bailout for the banks and a bubble in stocks. All of this low interest rates and quantitative easing is like trying to put a fire out with gasoline. It also monetizes government debt, historically this has always led to hyperinflation.

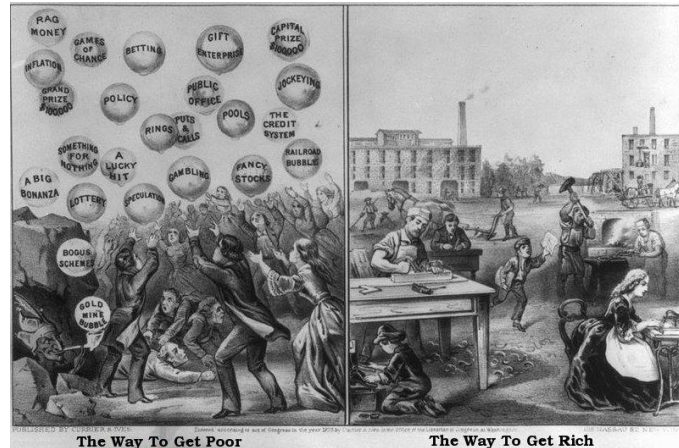


Derivatives

A derivative is a financial instrument that derives its value from something else. A value of a contract securing the price of something at some point in the future which hedges against a possible price change, for example. There are three types of derivatives: **futures** contract, which could be a forward exchange; **option**, a choice to buy or not buy something; or **swap**, the ability to exchange contracts in the future.

Derivatives can be quite useful in markets, especially in currency exchanges. Investors may speculate, which in the long term stabilizes the price for the asset by buying low and selling high. They may also use derivative contracts to hedge against risk by forgoing some potential profit. Banks reduce borrowing costs by trading off different terms of borrowing and charging a fee by **swapping** out loan agreements. Without well-established financial institutions, transaction costs would otherwise prohibit derivative markets.

Derivatives become dangerous however when financial institutions have taken the amount of risk by making these so called one way bets in the bubble economy. A future is like an 'I owe you' on paper which is literally adding supply into the market by fiat (banks can suppress the price of commodities in this way).



Mortgage backed securities were a transference of risk from commercial banks and sold to investment banks based on people paying their mortgages. In the fed's bailout and subsequent quantitative easing, bought \$600 billion worth of mortgage backed securities. This caused a moral hazard of banks not enduring the risks of mortgage lending, which preventing a full correction of the housing bubble. There is today a worldwide bond bubble, housing bubble, derivative bubble, stock bubble, and others.

Consumer Price Index

The government fudges two statistics: The consumer price index (CPI) and unemployment. The CPI is supposed to be a measure of inflation and unemployment an indirect measure of payroll of sorts. Historically, these

are the most widely reported statistics regarding the economy.

The CPI is supposed to report inflation by measuring price differences of a basket of goods over time⁶⁴. So if you include a set of diverse necessities and luxuries and calculate a price average, and then calculate the same set of goods a year later, that is supposed to give you price inflation. How these baskets are actually calculated underreports inflation by substituting goods of lesser value and claiming they are equal (i.e. substituting steak for hamburger) and averaging the price reductions that naturally happen in technology over time⁶⁵. The result of this is a CPI number that under reports actual price inflation.

Unemployment

Unemployment is supposed to be a measure of a lack of productivity and payroll. Labor force participation, employment, does not take into consideration of payroll, as more people are taking part time jobs. So if a business decides to get rid of a full time employee, and in his place hires two part time

employees, who combined are working the equivalent as the full time worker, the unemployment rate drops. As of 2014, there are in fact 86 million Americans who are capable of working but do not participate in the labor force⁶⁶⁶⁷. Employment numbers are also fudged by the so called "birth death model" of job creation; a statistical extrapolation of jobs being created due to the fact that it is impossible for the government to really know how many jobs are being created⁶⁸. Those who are able to work but have been unemployed for an extended amount of time are not counted in the unemployment number.

Gross domestic product

Government policy also boosts GDP because of their spending. GDP was shown to have increased in the last quarter of 2014 because of Obama care regulation⁶⁹. Keep in mind that people employed in the government sector are not as productive as in the private sector. Believe it or not, public sector employees make more than their private counterparts on average⁷⁰⁷¹⁷²⁷³.

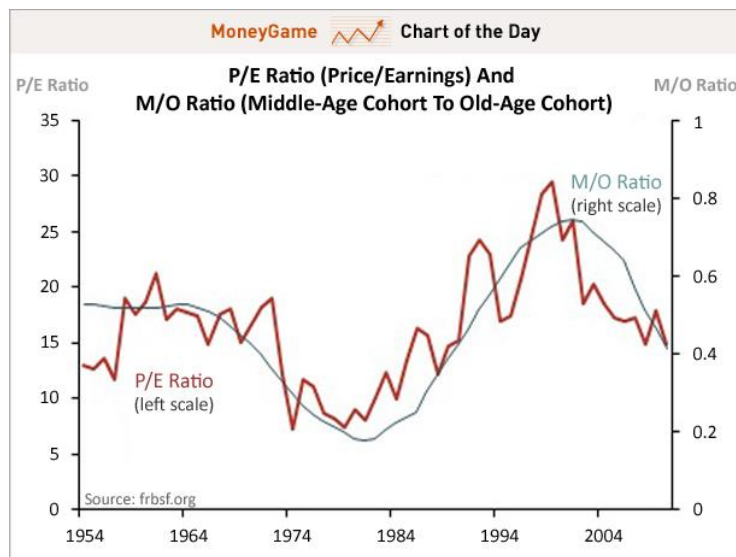
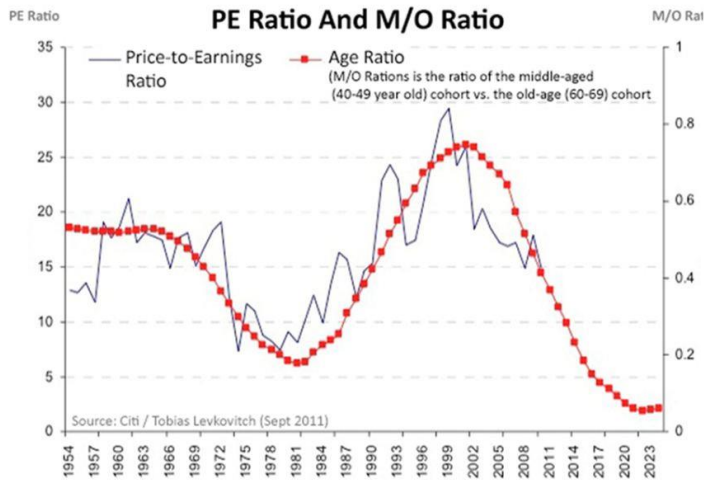

Demographics



This is a major factor of savings being produced versus savings being consumed. In this case, middle aged workers leveraging capital to produce the higher profit margins are aging and will likely begin consuming the money they saved and invested as they retire. The so called 'baby boom' generation are retiring en masse, and are taking their earned savings out of the

market. As a consequence, price levels in the economy should drop off as earnings also drop off. Only a source of cheap capital brought on by technology will absorb this likely future shock.

Welfare system

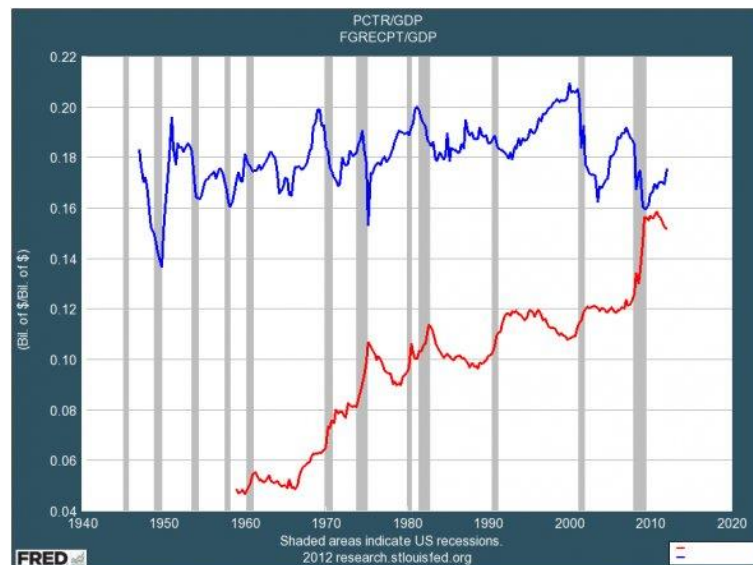
Much of the economy in the United States (Europe, and Japan) has become dependent on the welfare system. This should be raising a red flag, as this indicates less productive capacity in the whole economy; it is not sustainable.

The reason why most the top one percent of wealthy people are getting richer is due to their connection to the government (corporate welfare) and banks; they get the newly printed currency before it loses value via price inflation by doing business with the government and the financial sector. The recent bailouts to private corporations were the

crudest example of this; specifically the Federal Reserve helped in this capacity by buying commercial paper in their quantitative easing which significantly lowered the borrowing costs of these companies. A lot of this is also

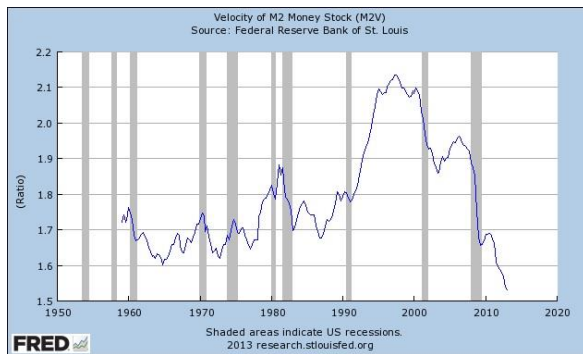
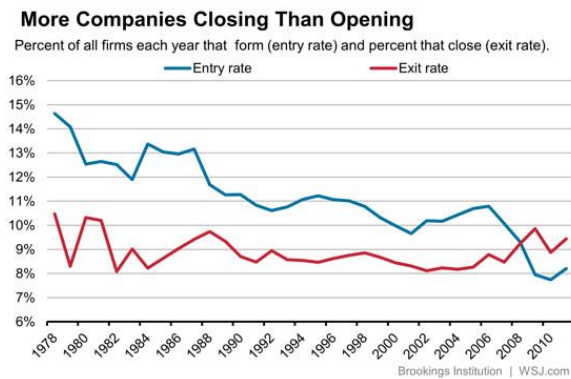


government (corporate welfare) and banks; they get the newly printed currency before it loses value via price inflation by doing business with the government and the financial sector. The recent bailouts to private corporations were the



from government contracts in the arms, prison, and medical industrial complexes. This is how dependent the American economy in its current state is dependent on the welfare system.

Business environment



Businesses are going out of business more than going into business for the first time since these records have been kept. This was probably the case during the 1930's as well. Overall confidence has slumped considerably, as evidenced by the slowing down of money velocity:

Solutions suppressed

As the price level rises, more people will be priced out of the market. These rising prices are the cost of the misallocations from the bubbles that were created by artificially low interest rates. Whenever the market contracts faster in the short term (faster than what people can adjust to with their output), assets become much cheaper for those who can still



afford them. The correction is the market returning to equilibrium.

Government can deregulate and repeal legal tender laws, making banking a free market endeavor. This of course would spell the death of big government. Government gets big as a result of central banking and fiat currency. Otherwise there would be an economic and political limitation of more visible taxation. If people were taxed explicitly for all of these expenditures, politicians would not find support for the nonsense you see today.



Gold standard

Historically countries used gold to balance international trade balance to equilibrium. If that balance was negative, gold flows out of the country and domestic



interest rates go up. If that balance was positive, gold flows in the country and domestic interest rates would go down; for the rest of world however, interest would go up. To bail out a

bank back then, a country would have to sell gold reserves to buy domestic assets that the bank could then sell for that currency in order to liquefy the bank's balance sheet. It was not just the trade balances, but the financial sector was more stable and the

government's power were all limited when money was convertible to gold.

Bretton Woods

The Bretton Woods system was an exchange system developed after World War II. Currency wars as they are called, occur when countries devalue their currencies in order to subsidize their manufacturing sectors in order to bring money into their respective countries. This was actually one of several reasons that lead to the start of World War II. At the end of World War II, a new system was established to stem any trade war and to facilitate an international trade.

The Bretton Woods agreement was a commitment to trade balance. Capital constraints were assumed to prevent speculation. Speculative flows insulated the differences in the leads and lags of exchange. In a free market system however, exchange rates float, which then also allow free capital flows. Monetary policy also distorts exchange rates and capital flows. For this reason the system collapsed in part because of discrete exchange rate adjustments which inspired speculative attacks, making internal and external balance difficult.



After the breakdown of Bretton Woods, the dollar kept its value by being the only currency used to buy oil. Deals were made back in the 1970's after Richard Nixon took the United States completely off the gold standard. These deals were partly made by Henry Kissinger and the Saudi Royal family; the United States would cease as the world's largest oil exporting country, but will institute a sort of peg for U.S. dollars to oil. Until recently, oil could only be bought on the international market with dollars, regardless of what country you were buying from. This has been called the 'petrodollar'⁷⁴⁷⁵. However, the petrodollar, and thus the dollar's status as reserve currency is in danger as U.S. debt becomes increasingly risky and countries enact bilateral trades (those that do not involve using U.S. dollars, such as agreements between Russia and China)⁷⁶. Because the U.S. dollar is the world reserve currency of today it is used to resolve global transactions when central banks of various countries execute exchanges among themselves. The United States is the only country in the world who prices



its liabilities in its own currency. So when the Federal Reserve inflates the supply of dollars, and the price of the dollar depreciates, U.S.

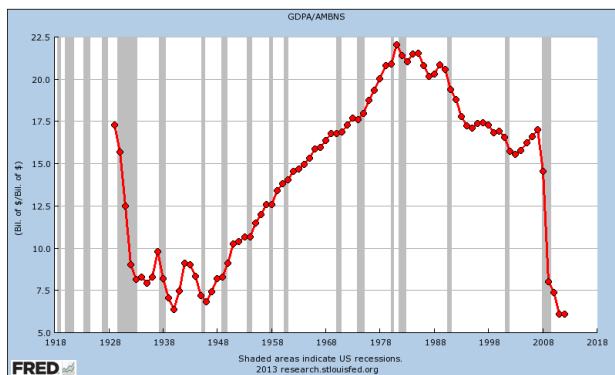

liabilities actually decrease! If the U.S. dollar was not the reserve currency, it could not run large trade imbalances or run up as large of debts as it does.

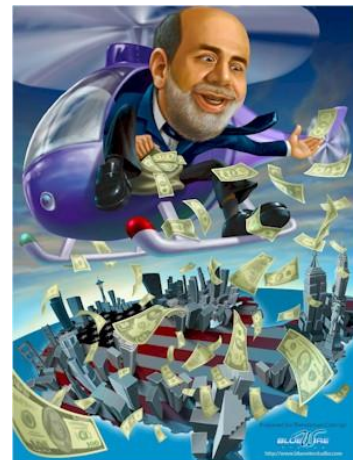
Why not hyperinflation?

Noticed what was written before about monetary inflation **leads** to price inflation. Hypothetically, price inflation can happen if the currency supply were unchanged⁷⁷⁷⁸. Either an increase in the number of times currency exchanges through the economy, or a net destruction could occur leaving less goods to be purchased will increase the price level in the economy. Alternatively, prices in the economy will drop if more values were produced, quantity of money stayed the same, and people saved their money.



With public confidence so low, capitalists have not made the investments needed to continue

wage growth, keeping real incomes relatively low. Despite the massive creation of currency, the central tendency in the real economy (non-financial and government associated)

is deflation. Central banks around the world are printing currency in order to stave off the deflation in the hopes of creating more bubbles and rising asset prices.

China

A fundamentally important domestic goal for the Chinese government is full employment, and since most of their GDP is exports, they desire a cheap currency. This causes massive trade imbalances. So for example, say US dollars flows into a Chinese businessman's account, the central bank of China does something called



sterilization; that is they print Yuan to buy U.S. debt (called us currency reserves, which are assets on the Chinese bank's balance sheet) so that the yuan does not value more over to the

U.S. dollar. Otherwise the value of the dollar would fall and the yuan would rise, and trade would move into equilibrium. This is how sterilization happens:

- US dollars get deposited into Chinese bank
- Chinese bank trades those US dollars for yuan at central bank
- Yuan gets credited to the Chinese business man that were printed by the Chinese central bank
- Chinese central bank buys US Treasury with those original dollars.



- So effectively the central bank of China prints yuan and buys Treasuries.

- These transactions are matched with yuan printing, and currency flows back into the US.

- Chinese central bank becomes a large holder of

U.S. debt.

- The yuan does not appreciate over the dollar, and the Chinese can continue the policy of full employment by subsidizing Chinese exports in this way.

Much of China's economy is based on exports. The Chinese central bank depreciates their currency by inflation. As a result, massive amounts of resources in the Chinese economy have been misallocated to keep with this condition; this has created a massive housing bubble. When China's massive financial bubble bursts, some of the capital will flow back into the United States. No one knows much of this will affect the American economy.

Economic prediction

- Despite zero percent target fed funds rate, the economy will slow, as a result of low overall confidence in the overall economic outlook. The 'glut' of baby boom savers and investors are retiring and capitalists are sensing too much risk to invest,

therefore real wages will stagnate for the next decade or so.

- The fed will react by allowing some financial deflation to occur via psychology and deleveraging. This gives them more policy room to inflate later.
- Money velocity will fall again, from the start of the deflation, to the beginning of the currency creation since there is now more currency that can change hands with lower business volume. The goal here is to create enough inflation to prevent asset price correction, but not enough to create hyperinflation.
- By keeping asset prices above fair value, money velocity will continue to fall as capital investments are not being made, thus real wages will continue to decline. Without the deflation (asset correction), confidence will remain low.

The hope is, that this new currency will be spent to continue to keep asset prices above fair value while inflating away government debt. Congress will not significantly cut spending. The newer generations, despite their all of their official education, will not generate the real income needed to prop up high asset prices. Since the system cannot affect real wages by incentivizing capital investments like they hoped for in their near zero percent interest rates, they are trying to drive up aggregate demand by raising consumer confidence. However, without the increase in real income, money velocity will continue to fall. The central tendency in the economy as a whole will be deflation. As the economy continues to slow down, prices will have the

inclination to fall, shown by a fall in the velocity of money. Many people bet on rising asset prices that deflation brings about a political backlash. The fed can only print money in response to falling asset prices.

Bubbles burst as a result of either the fed raising rates to stem too much inflation (risk of hyperinflation), rates going up naturally as risk increases, consumers are priced out of the market and demand and thus prices fall precipitously, or if confidence and expectations falter in the bubble itself. The only way out of this situation is quantitative easing. The question is, what assets will the central bank buy and how long will the critical mass of individuals have faith in the currency financial system?

All of this will lead into an economic collapse. The lack of capital investment since 2009 and decades of inflation induced theft had weakened the economy. The system is based on faith, and when that faith is lost and money velocity rises, the whole system collapses. People will lose faith in the system when "money" is recognized as currency. Money velocity will spike and hyperinflation will ensue. This theft would not possible if people did not use faith as a cognitive standard. This correction will be a significant event in recent human history when it is realized.

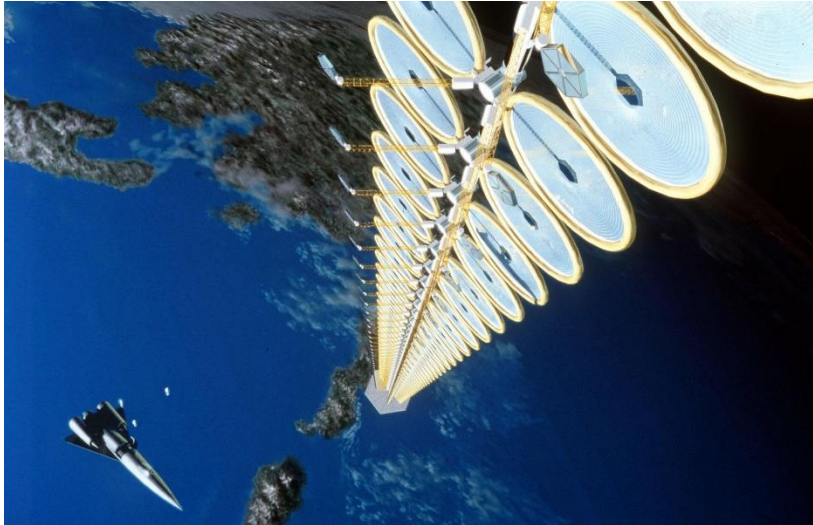
Chapter eight

Toward economic expansion

When you see a person advocating for economic freedom, you look at a person who believes he is capable of mastery of himself. To say that geography alone determines wealth distribution is not to understand the nature of man. Capital richness can occur anywhere in the world in the not too distant future, provided that a government exists that allows individuals to flourish and investments are safe. Savings and profits are needed to conduct research and development, which occur where government interferes least; historically this has been in the United States, but can occur anywhere. A free market generates the most capital of any system, thus making it easier to control nature. Geography however does determine the cost of capital on a larger scale, but technology can overcome that.

- Three dimensional printing will replace the need to transport specialty equipment and machinery, and possibly anything else. Transaction costs are overcome by technology (capital).
- Labor being replaced by robots and computers, so that both labor and capital become cheaper. A service can also lower transaction costs, but can also be replaced by technology.
- Using sand instead of water in fracking, making oil production cheaper in areas that was once cost prohibited.

- Technology needed to develop orbital solar farms is currently being developed, eliminating the need for fossil fuels.



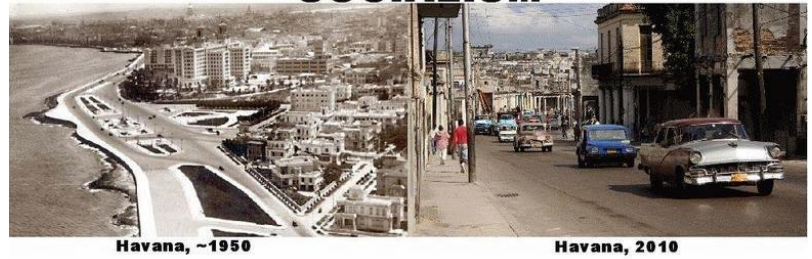
Imagine that people discover that external authorities, including central banks, are not necessary. The role of banking is to transfer risk and savings. More

specifically, a bank attracts savings for safe keeping, leverages only the risk it is willing to take, and make loans and sell financial policies such as certificates of deposits. As income increase in real terms, markets expand. With economic growth and an unchanging quantity of money, prices would actually decrease in a period of economic growth. There are two implications to this: governments no longer can use monetary debasement as a tax and savings and investments are easier to make because money increases in value and the price level in the whole economy would fall depending on economic growth. You would have to consider the opportunity costs of deflation instead of outperforming inflation.

Geography or free markets?

What determines a wealthy location: geography and trade relationships from that location, or lack of government interference of productive individuals in that area? All wealth creation comes from the mind of a conscious individual. A lack of excessive government will allow a faster rate of wealth creation, and geographic location may determine the transaction costs of doing business with those individuals, assuming that these costs are not dealt with technologically.

- Applying technology to infrastructure to reduce the cost of capital in the long term.
- Privatizing the space industry, which will expose it to market dynamics.
- By accessing a very cheap source of fuel worldwide, possibly achieved by solar farms orbiting around the sun and beaming that energy back to Earth.
- Possibly harnessing gravity for power generation.
- Reduce travel time by applying technology and cheap energy.
- Use similar technology to move earth around to control the planet with ease.

- Weather modification to control droughts, and expand the amount of arable land.

Imagine if infrastructure could be built much cheaper and more effectively than it is now; imagine individuals in even the poorest places on Earth tapping into energy at very little cost to them; imagine no one forcibly acting as an authority to usurp values; and also imagine no destruction happens as a result of weather, and the climate can be fine-tuned to allow all living things to flourish, especially humans. Instead of competing for basic natural resources, such as fossil fuels and arable land, these people can compete for higher order values such as real-estate orbiting around the Earth, or mineral deposits at the bottom of the ocean.

Demographics or free markets?

Historically, human beings have a life cycle: They start off having no skills, but then grow older and acquire skills. As a result, older adults contribute to a pool of savings and investment because they are leveraging the most capital in the system. The more savings means that it is cheaper to borrow money; the lower the natural rate of interest.

Now imagine that there is a so called demographic crisis. People are not producing children at a rate that statistically replaces the older generations. Over the next few decades, the economic area (or country) has a

larger percentage of elderly people who do not contribute to the labor force as the percentage of younger workers decline in proportion to the population. This scenario means there are relatively more consumers in an area than there are relative producers that would have contributed to the same standard of living as before.

Now imagine another situation: You look at a poorer, agricultural country and see a fast growing population. There are far more children than there are young adults, and far more young adults than older adults. Again, there is more consumption of basic goods than there are older people able to leverage capital. The result is a relatively lower standard of living.

Price of labor adjusts, bringing workers where they are needed; at any skill level. This is especially the case if costs of moving labor and capital are low enough to make the basic necessities cheap where the migration costs become very low. Here are three steps politically to combat the “demographic crisis.”

- Abolishing the welfare state, so that migrants do not drain values from established population by force of government.
- Deregulate the medical industry so they may be able to cure aging. Potentially solving the so called demographic crisis without the need for migration.
- Deregulated markets allow costs of living to be lower, therefore reducing the costs of raising a child,

would also help to alleviate the mass aging of a population.

The protection service

History is not the metaphorical straight line of progress; more wealth would have been available in the economy as a whole if it were not for the mystical demand for excess government⁷⁹. A good legal system assumes that you have the ability to control the environment you are in upon becoming an adult. There is only a need for so much government to raise the risk for (therefore price) crime. Voting with this regard is contextual to how risk averse each individual is. The less people are subject to the authority of outside of themselves, the less subject each individual is to vote on tyranny.

Chapter Nine

Introduction to politics

Politicians cannot legislate happiness. The idea of government will absolutely protect you is an absolute fiction. Property rights do put limits on corruption however. The higher the ranks of government, you will on average find that the motive is not defense of the citizens so much as it is the preservation of the elite. The parasitic elites may see that by using the various media to condition the populace on a legal system that makes sense politically for them; enough property protection so that people can produce enough for them to steal and laws to act like rules to make people easier to 'manage.' As people get increasingly difficult to control, expect governments to get increasingly oppressive.

Cultivating external authority in the masses



The power of parasitic elites can only be as strong as the errors that exist in the minds of the people. The remnants of the animal mind allow loopholes to exist because it prefers to give into impulses without having to expose those loopholes. It is easier to listen to a song with a pleasurable sound and destructive lyrics than to acknowledge the song for what it is and discontinue listening to it. In order for a person to free oneself from

those loopholes, one must put forth effort into purposeful self-education and in turn become honest, but that would cost the weaker mind's existence for the stronger mind.

Many institutions are aimed at making you a subservient person to an authority outside of yourself, programming you to act altruistically; to act in a way that undermines your survival. This in turn conditions you to invest in a system that is intent on committing fraud on your behalf. With few exceptions, nearly all political systems have done this.

Maintaining the external control

People seek out external authority because of the problems caused by those authorities. Too often, people do not look deep enough to discover this. Government for example, may create poverty by regulation (say, price and capital controls) and impoverishes many people. The addition of authority becomes "justified" by the elites to fight the poverty the government created. The elites may go on to create even more problems by instituting wealth transfers from productive people to less productive people, plunging individuals further into poverty. They will also likely institute a police state by surveillance, predatory laws, and employ additional police and military that views everyone with extra suspicion. Those with weaker minds may seek to escape reality by use of controlled substances or entertainment, this in turn weakens those individuals further making them increasingly vulnerable. With the fiat money system

cranking, along with the mainstream media, entertainment, drugs and alcohol, there is incredible complacency with people, especially in places like the United States. The fiat money system also ensures that people can easily make a living. Under such conditions, independent thinking is not necessary for survival, unless you want to escape the predatory system. The stupidity of individuals are then emphasized in media and government in order to justify even more external authority.



How people are destroyed

Collectivization and its application, the legal system, is a means of destroying individuals. Average people think that rules are their

guide to action; whereas rules may function as weapons by the elite. They can use these laws to tax or otherwise drain you productively. Or by breaking one of their subjective laws, can label you as 'convict' and destroy an important asset of yours: your reputation.

Because one of their techniques of controlling individuals is to condition people into permanent emotionally negative modes, intellectual growth is stunted among the masses. Fear misdirects a person's focus away from controlling the situation. While the misdirection goes on, the system attempts to determine you into a false paradigm whereas the solution does not exist within it.



Chapter ten

How collectivism is currently cultivated in the masses

"If the American people ever allow private banks to control the issue of their currency, first by inflation, then by deflation, the banks and corporations that will grow up around them will deprive the people of all property until their children wake up homeless on the continent their Fathers conquered...I believe that banking institutions are more dangerous to our liberties than standing armies..."

-Thomas Jefferson

"The few who can understand the system will be either so interested in its profits, or so dependent on its favours, that there will be no opposition from that class, while, on the other hand, that great body of people, mentally incapable of comprehending the tremendous advantage that Capital derives from the system, will bear its burden without complaint and, perhaps, without even suspecting that the system is inimical to their interests."

-Letter dated June 25 1863 written from London by the Rothschilds to their New York agents introducing their banking method into America.

The Council on Foreign Relations

The Federal Reserve Act was written in 1910 in a place called Jekyll Island, Georgia. It was written in near complete secrecy by the most powerful bankers and industrialists of the day⁸⁰:

Frank Vanderlip, Henry P. Davison, Charles D. Norton, Benjamin Strong, and Paul Warburg; and by their political advisors Edward Mandell House, Abram Piatt Andrew, Jr., and Senator Nelson Aldrich⁸¹.

(10-1)

These men wrote legislation for congress to make it appear as if to regulate the banking industry; by the very interests who wrote it. The Federal Reserve Act was introduced by one of the attendees, Nelson Aldrich⁸².

These men had connections to the banking elite in America and Europe, connections like JP Morgan, William Rockefeller, Kuhn, Loeb and Company, the Warburg banking group in Germany and the Netherlands, and The Rothschild banks of France and England⁸³. Once a central bank had been established in America, a relatively small group of men could draw off, in time, from the financial resources of an emerging economic powerhouse that was the United States. This group of industrialists and bankers set out to control media outlets and polices through think tanks. In 1915, JP Morgan went out to buy out the 25 most influential newspapers of the day and replaced their editors⁸⁴. In 1919 Edward M. House formed the Institute for International Affairs in New York City, which would later form the core of the Council on Foreign Relations whose charter was financed by:

The Federal Reserve Act was signed into law by then president Woodrow Wilson. His most trusted advisor was also one of the most prominent members and founder of the CFR, Edward M. House. This is what the president said afterwards:

"I am a most unhappy man. I have unwittingly ruined my country. A great industrial nation is controlled by its system of credit. Our system of credit is concentrated. The growth of the nation, therefore, and all our activities are in the hands of a few men. We have come to be one of the worst ruled, one of the most completely controlled and dominated Governments in the civilized world no longer a Government by free opinion, no longer a Government by conviction and the vote of the majority, but a Government by the opinion and duress of a small group of dominant men."

Individuals in these organizations used their money and influence to raise their collectivist ideology to prominence. 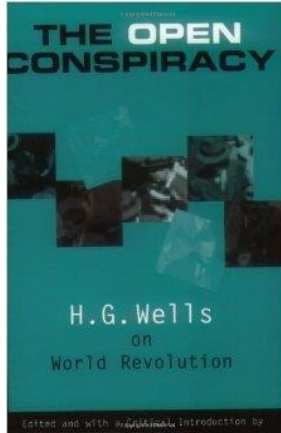

elite may fund which ever studies that will form their basis, such as funding women’s studies, yet neglecting to study the effects of testosterone has on men’s behavior.



Each individual has their own goals, but the general thesis by these Western collectivists is to funnel wealth to a centralized corporate/government structure.

This pseudo business structure will control your very being via legitimate law; owning a patent on your DNA⁹⁰ or implementing an electronic cashless system⁹¹ that will allow a centralized authority to decide whether or not you will be able to participate in any types of commerce. They can simply disable your means of transaction if the people running such a system decide they do not like you; you will not be able to buy groceries if you protest.

The news media uses marketing techniques to create the appearance of credibility and entertainment in order to position themselves as external authorities. It then uses this authority to condition individuals into various CFR agendas. Those agendas range anywhere from creating a false consensus⁹² against ideologies that the CFR does not support to conditioning individuals to support a war for the CFR cause⁹³. They do this all within a marketable range that they know what many individuals are willing to accept⁹⁴. Of course all of this means that your "news" is biased⁹⁵⁹⁶.

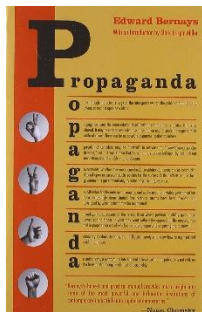

The application of feminism

The media may indicate something like a gender pay gap (which there is not one)⁹⁸, or use the entertainment industry to equate a lack of impulse control with intrinsic "status" by celebrities⁹⁹, or by reporting that women are the default "victim," and that men are expendable¹⁰⁰.

Feminism is a form of mind control. Look at many sitcoms and you will see women dominate men; as if to condition men and women that a woman is an authority for the man. This was also done with the help of the CIA¹⁰¹¹⁰².

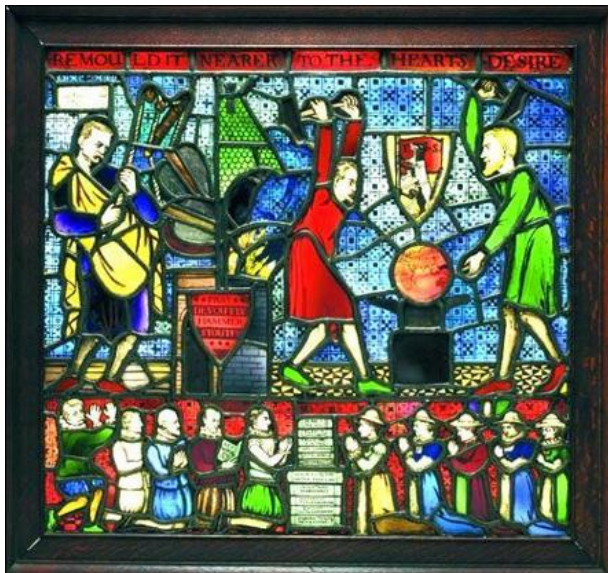

The goal was to have a new type of submission the standard of interaction. Women submit to government, men submit to women and government. What are genetically modified organisms (GMOs)?

When DNA of a living thing is altered by biotechnology (genetic engineering, not crossbreeding), it is called a genetically modified organism (GMO). Scientists find a DNA strand that encodes, for say, a pesticide, and literally shoots it into, say, a potato cell. The DNA scrambles into the potatoes original DNA, and creates a whole new DNA strand. When a DNA strand that has been synthetically created, one that did not exist before, it codes for amino acids that did not exist prior to the scrambling of DNA. Prior to genetic engineering there was 20 different amino acids that occurred naturally, now there are many more (possibly hundreds, mostly in laboratories). These new amino acids will have a very fundamental impact on future biology that is not yet well understood¹⁴⁰.

The promise of such technology is that it will increase crop yields throughout the world, making this agricultural technique economically beneficial to poorer individuals. There are two common types of GMO crops: one that has a pesticide gene inserted into the plant, and the second has a gene which makes it resilient to a certain pesticide.

The largest producer of genetically engineered species is a company called Monsanto. Monsanto is not a free market company, in fact far from it. Many of its executives are former FDA officials and some FDA officials become Monsanto executives. Monsanto is also one of those corporations that have lobbyists, finance political campaigns that they like, etc. In short, Monsanto does not have the same incentive that a free market corporation does in producing products because it gets its so called stamp of approval from the government.

Animals have been shown to become infertile after a few generations of eating GMO potatoes or corn.¹⁴¹ One possible reason for this is the glyphosate (a



xenoestrogen)¹⁴² that is used as an herbicide in Roundup used for the GMO crops; plants that were genetically engineered specifically to withstand Monsanto's patented roundup. When you eat GMOs, you may well be eating something that is saturated in an estrogenic compound

that has been shown to cause infertility and possibly increase cancer risks and organ failures¹⁴³.

The silence of the media

First, the CFR network and foundations decide where money goes for scientific studies. You will hardly find a study on testosterone and its effects on psychology, because this does not benefit the CFR agenda of feminization and collectivization; science does become politically motivated in this way. Second, the news media also highly influenced via the CFR network¹⁴⁴. Third, Monsanto itself is very much involved in regulatory positions in government¹⁴⁵, and hires private mercenaries to infiltrate those in opposition to them¹⁴⁶.

Drinking toxic waste: Fluoridation of water

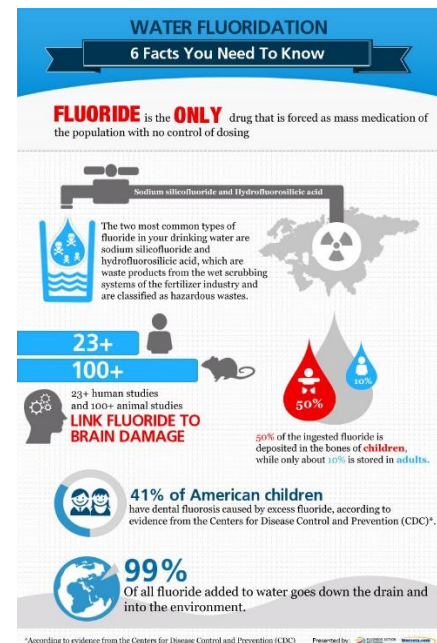
as insecticidal spays for fruits and vegetables (cryolite and barium fluosilicate) and the mining and conversion of phosphate rock to superphosphate, which is used as fertilizer."

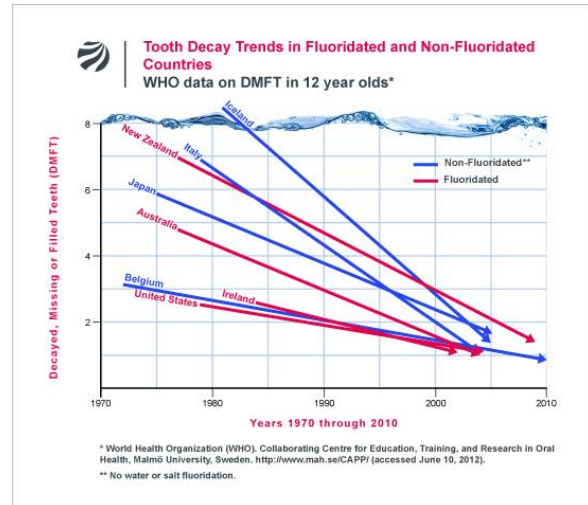

The enemy here is the demand for external authority. The United States Centers for Disease Control calls it “one of the greatest public health achievements of the century.” The problem is, some people actually believe this.

The following is a survey of U.S. operations in the 20th and 21st centuries. The United States is the most prolific at implementing clandestine operations, but it is by far

not the only government that has applied them, whether currently or historically. (This is **not** an exhausted list!)

- The Soviet Union had psychological experiments on political prisoners they deemed mentally unfit. This program was horrific and at one point even caught international attention.
- The French government has a history of covert operations in its former colonies in western Africa.
- Israeli intelligence, Mossad, helped to create the terrorist organization Hamas¹⁵⁹
- British agents, MI-6, stages a fake terror plot in Basra, Iraq¹⁶⁰¹⁶¹

The Soviet Union for example had clandestine operations throughout the world during the cold war, focused primarily on subversion techniques and arms shipments. There were cases where both the Soviet Union and the United States would compete for influence in any given area with both sides remaining officially silent. There is much to be known about U.S. operations thanks to the freedom of information act¹⁶². **The purpose of the following is not slander the United States government in particular, but rather shows that**

governments do in fact conduct clandestine operations.

Keep in mind that the foundations discussed earlier highly influence government policy via media control and political controls. Historically and currently, governments are directed toward some form of collective controls for their populations. Clandestine operations are used to change public opinion in such a way that serves to keep or boost faith in the fiat system. This is especially true when the political discourse is not going the way the ruling class wants. Clandestine, or false flags change that discourse.

Here is a brief survey into American false flag operations:

USS Maine: Explosions occurred inside the ship, which then was blamed on Spain. This was the pretext of the Spanish American War¹⁶³.



Lusitania, World War I (1917)

When the Lusitania sent off to Britain, it carried an arsenal of military supplies¹⁶⁴. The German embassy

tried to warn American civilians not to book passage on that ship. They placed advertisement newspapers, mostly along the eastern seaboard, warning that the Lusitania would be in danger, that it was heading into hostile waters, and that Americans should not be on board¹⁶⁵. The U.S. State Department contacted all of those newspapers and ordered them not to publish the ad. The purpose of this was to make it a tragedy that would anger the American people to support a war against Germany.



Discussions of a Fascist coup d'état

The Rockefellers and those associated with them, (including individuals like Prescott Bush) were all admirers of Adolf Hitler. They attempted to use U.S. marine general Smedley Butler and a force of 500,000 troops to overthrow the current government and establish a fascist dictatorship¹⁶⁶.

Events during World War II

The American and British had trans-Atlantic discussions of an impending war with Germany before the Pearl Harbor event¹⁶⁷. In November, in response to the October 31, 1941 sinking of the USS Reuben James, the Neutrality Act was partly repealed to protect U.S. military aid to Britain.

USS Kearny

Again, Great Britain was in trouble, and the elite also sensed that there would be future problems with Nazi Germany and Japan. Franklin Roosevelt ordered Naval ships to escort British ships that carried war supplies. Next, he ordered U.S. ships to place themselves in between an attacking German ship and a British ship. Finally, USS Kearny was damaged when a German torpedo struck it when it came between a British ship and a German U-boat¹⁶⁸. Roosevelt made a speech to the nation stating that Germany essentially declared war on America. It was widely discovered shortly after that this was a policy by the Roosevelt administration, and the public did not buy Roosevelt's rhetoric.

Traffic in the seas between Hawaii and Japan was ordered to be redirected in the months before the attack on Pearl Harbor. This was ordered after intercepting communications from a Japanese spy at Pearl Harbor. With a vacant seas policy, meaning that all commerce and military shipping was to be redirected away from a geographic area of the Pacific where the Japanese vector of attack would occur¹⁶⁹¹⁷⁰. Therefore no one was supposed to see and warn of an impending attack. Some did however. Man aboard USS Boise saw fleet that later bombed Pearl Harbor¹⁷¹. The British and American elite finally have the reason for the American people to go to war with Germany.

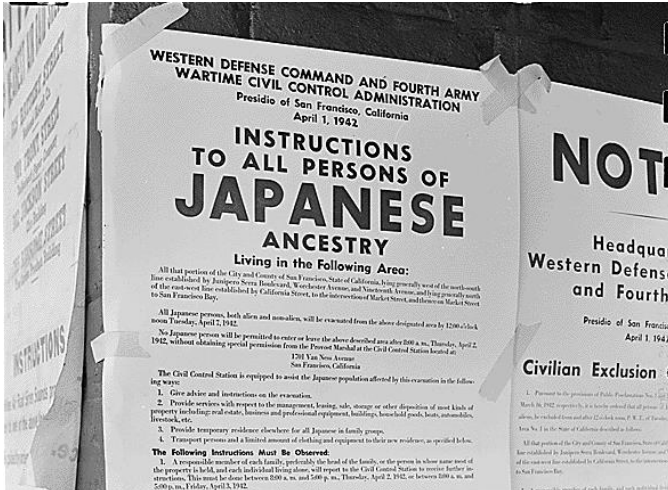

Japanese Americans suffered internment in camps, mostly in California; it was believed that they could



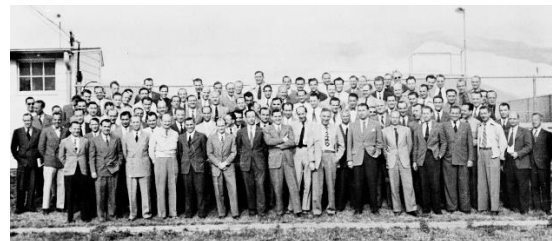
potentially become a threat during the war. Their property was also confiscated¹⁷².

There was a failure to negotiate the release of U.S. prisoners of war held by the Soviet Union¹⁷³.

The CIA does experiments on mind control, typically using narcotics on American subjects without their knowledge or against their will. 1962: Thailand. Brigade of 5,000 United States Marines to resist threat to Thai government from Pathet Lao. Successful.

1963: South Vietnam. Precipitate conditions leading to assassination of Ngo Dinh Diem. Successful.

1963: Dominican Republic. Overthrow government of Juan Bosch in military coup. Successful.

1963: Ecuador. Overthrow government of Carlos Julio Arosemena. Successful.

Fulfilling elite's agenda through physical force: Construction of a technocratic police state

- Set any pretenses necessary by using the external authority mechanism. This can be done even by the use of false flag operations.
- Create the means of the police state, such as constructing institutions capable of handling mass numbers of prisoners.
- Do preliminary targeting of those capable of politically challenging the system.

- To use a technocratic policing system (militarized) for domestication operations; this may acclimate individuals to being searched on a regular basis, for example.
- Prevent the rise of competing institutions, such as using televised media to politically discredit alternative media sources.

The goal of a police state is to domesticate and target those who do not accept the system on the basis of faith and are not a part of the ruling elite. These are individuals that typically get the label conservative, libertarian, or “right wing extremists.” The televised media uses real criminals as examples of domestic terrorism, and then gives those criminals labels that can apply to anyone; as if every individual was responsible for the criminal’s act. It is not advisable that you commit yourself to any irrational organization or ideology. The point here is to show you that any person can be targeted with the label “terrorist²¹⁶,” such a label carries the possibility of being ruled as an enemy combatant and suffering indefinite detention.

- If you join either a police or military department and are ideologically sympathetic to individuals such as Thomas Jefferson or George Washington, you are considered an infiltrator²²³²²⁴.
- If you oppose the policy of the government giving voter ID cards to masses of illegal immigrants you are called a racists and terrorist²²⁵
- If you prefer alternative media over traditional news media you are a potential terrorist²²⁶²²⁷.
- If you own a firearm or protest taxes you are a terrorist²²⁸.

- If you use logical arguments or able to convince individuals something that contradicts government agenda you are a terrorist²²⁹²³⁰.
- If you post pictures of government vehicles, can be labeled a terrorist²³¹

To physically take over such a large geographical area such as the United States, and being the fourth most populated country on Earth, requires a significant logistical capacity. This means constructing a highly organized and systematized structure that will have to employ all of its enforcement capacity by militarization²³²²³³ using that ridged intrinsic hierarchy.

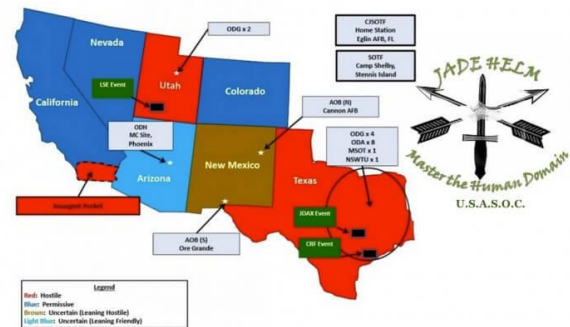

This is a system that will run simulations of continuity of government during crisis²³⁴, confiscate firearms over large areas²³⁵, use violence against those who attempt to politically challenge the system²³⁶, use violence who uses organized communication to offer a protection service that is not controlled by the intrinsic hierarchy of external authorities²³⁷²³⁸, do combat training in American style suburban settings²³⁹, are especially concerned about returning combat veterans that could be more difficult for the system to physically control²⁴⁰, and even use boy scouts, whom are being trained to fight Americans²⁴¹.

Prison camps

Within elitist circles, there are recommendations and policy written for martial law and internment camps in the case of a national

emergency²⁴². The purpose of which of course is continuity of government²⁴³²⁴⁴. Politicians even campaigned and have gone on televised news advocating for the use of internment camps.²⁴⁵²⁴⁶ Internment camps have been used before in American history during national crisis²⁴⁷. An entire system for the purpose of incarcerating²⁴⁸ those that the policing system deems a problem, killing demonstrators²⁴⁹²⁵⁰ confiscating firearms²⁵¹²⁵² and even using pastors to pacify individuals during martial law²⁵³²⁵⁴. If people are unarmed, then police will not have the logistical capacity to handle the increase in violent crime. The whole purpose is again, continuity of government, not keeping any kind of

intrinsic order, not that such an order exists anyway. A leaked U.S. document²⁵⁵ reveals the intention of such infrastructure, legal precedents, and training, summarized by the following:

- Identifies malcontents, trained agitators, and political leaders within the facility who may try to organize resistance or create disturbances.
- Develops and executes indoctrination programs to reduce or remove antagonistic attitudes.
- Identifies political activists.
- Provides loudspeaker support (such as administrative announcements and facility instructions when necessary).
- Helps the military police commander control detainee and DC populations during emergencies.
- Plans and executes a PSYOP program that produces an understanding and appreciation of U.S. policies and actions.

What the government can do to you

Government is a monopoly of force by definition. The United States government was in large part established as a protection service and not a mandate²⁵⁶. Political power, or false power, is highly addicting and destructive to those who seek it²⁵⁷ which is why extensive force rule

becomes dangerous over time. The following are six examples (not exhaustive) of the government going beyond its proper scope:

- Use banks as surveillance against you if are selling precious metals or you are a firearms dealer²⁵⁸.
- The IRS can restrict your travel²⁵⁹.
- or seize your accounts on suspicion alone, without any crime committed on your part²⁶⁰.
- Obtaining information illegally²⁶¹²⁶²²⁶³.
- Evicting a woman from her house because it does not follow **international** code, that is, not being connected to a power grid²⁶⁴.
- Force “educate” you if you think an industry conspires in for or against something²⁶⁵.
- Force medical practices for the purpose of conditioning parents²⁶⁶²⁶⁷.

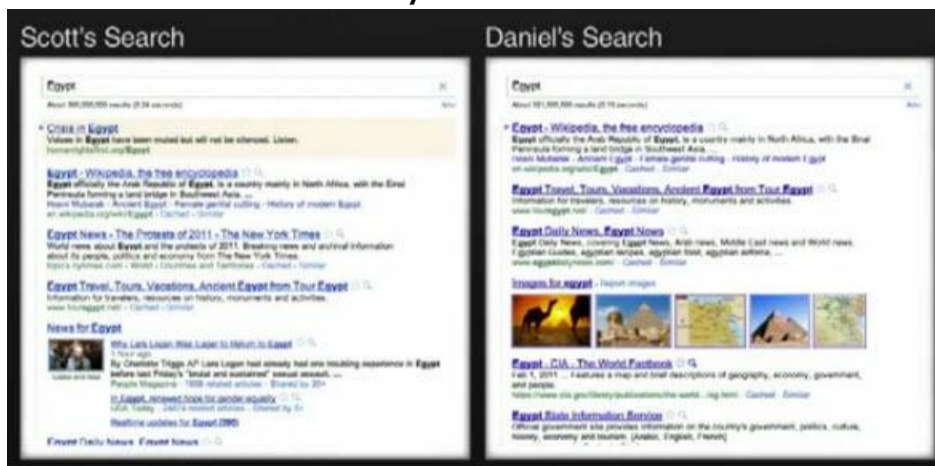

Technology used for surveillance

Google and Facebook can predict what kind of decisions you will likely make based on building actuaries on what you do on the internet²⁷⁰²⁷¹



and build information barriers so that online searches are tailored to that specific individual²⁷², therefore communication of vital information is blocked. Your phones can be remotely turned on by the National Security

Administration and listen to²⁷³, your television sets and computer can also spy on you²⁷⁴.

Imagine all of this new technology being used to hinder your individual, purposeful action that is controlled remotely. Driverless cars²⁷⁵ will prevent you to make changes to your plans as you need to do so.

Robots will patrol the streets to enforce any ridiculous police state law and regulation, and will operant punish those who break those laws without fail²⁷⁶, all of this will condition you that you do not have control over yourself²⁷⁷.

Like anything else about technology, this can either advance the interest of individuals or be used as a weapon²⁷⁸²⁷⁹. It is possible to make it rain in a certain area by cloud seeding²⁸⁰²⁸¹²⁸². Governments around the world with significant resources do weather controlling experiments, sometimes under the guise of fighting global warming²⁸³²⁸⁴²⁸⁵.

5.19 Case Study

Solutions for Global Warming

In 1997, the United Nations held a meeting on the environment in Kyoto, Japan. The hot topic was climate change due to greenhouse gases. Participating countries, including the United States, made concrete commitments to cut carbon dioxide emissions. Now opposition within the United States is mounting, saying the commitments are too difficult to achieve.

(a) What groups might not favor reducing carbon dioxide emissions?
(b) Give at least one concern each of these groups might have.

Fossil Fuels and Carbon Dioxide
Combustion (burning) is a rapid chemical reaction in which a fuel reacts with oxygen to produce heat and light. The burning of fossil fuels, such as gasoline and natural gas, releases carbon dioxide and water. As we burn more fossil fuels, the level of carbon dioxide in Earth's atmosphere has increased from 280 parts per million (ppm) 100 years ago to 355 ppm in 1993. Scientists project the level of carbon dioxide could reach 700 ppm by 2050.

(c) List at least three technologies that burn fossil fuels.
(d) How are scientists able to make projections about the levels of carbon dioxide 50 years from now?

Voices of Caution
Not every scientist accepts that higher carbon dioxide levels and global warming are unnatural. Evidence from fossils and other sources suggests that global temperatures and carbon dioxide levels have gone up and down many times in the past. For example, about 135 million years ago, long before there were any human beings, the level of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere exceeded 1000 ppm. That level is much higher than the present level.

(e) Previous episodes of global warming may have been caused by carbon dioxide gas from volcanoes and not by humans. Should we be concerned about global warming that is caused by humans? Explain your answer.

Finding a Solution
Scientists often use mini-ecosystems and computer models to test hypotheses. They are using them now to test technological solutions to global warming. Presented below are three possibilities. No plan is without its problems. You will be asked to consider the consequences of each technological fix.

Use Sun Block
The eruption of Mount Pinatubo in the Philippines in 1991 shot a plume of ash and debris 20 000 m into the atmosphere. The ash spread around the Earth. Climatologists estimate that the blanket cooled the globe on average about 0.7°C, at least in tropical areas. Could we deliberately add particles to the atmosphere? Running jet engines on richer mixtures of fuel would add particles to the atmosphere (see Figure 1). Burning coal adds soot to the air. Creating either kind of sunscreen would be cheap.

(f) Why would ash and particles in the atmosphere cool the Earth?
(g) What are some possible problems with this solution?

How to outcompete the system

When people no longer use faith as a cognitive standard:

- Currency loses its value and is replaced with money
- Government loses its effectiveness outside of operating as a protection service
- Individuals become increasingly independent and productive

How the system becomes undermined:

1. Become fully conscious yourself (chapter one)
2. Understand human nature (chapters two, three, and four)
3. Know what is fundamentally corrupting people (chapter five)
4. Know how to use classical and operant conditioning in order to reject dependency and reward independency for those who still rely on external authority. Use the conditioning to motivate them into becoming fully conscious. This also creates expectations to be acted on.
5. Know how to navigate the current system of its pitfalls (chapters six, seven, nine, and ten)
6. Idealize a system that will replace the current and corrupted one with one that is rational and productive (chapters eight and twelve)

The government itself has to be infiltrated with this information; to the degree in which it does will change the nature of the enforcement of government. An institution needs to be created to govern those who do not know how to govern themselves that will function in the event that the current government collapses, possibly from hyperinflation. New institutions will also be created when people spend money in such a way that rejects pseudo-businesses and supports businesses that offer real values.

Reaction to their downfall

The elites will not like people being able to challenge their system in any way; this even means individuals acquiring the means of self-defense. Staying in power is the principle objective of the elite. They will go as far as using nuclear weapons as either a false flag or to start a nuclear war another government, as enemies are created whenever it suits them, such as with ISIS. Preservation of the elite and their faith based system are more important to them than the combined lives of everyone on the planet.

They have immense resources at their disposal, including a whole 'credited' media infrastructure, technology such as google analytics to predict human activity, and a large governing infrastructure that includes and experienced police and military (some of which have been trained to think that American people themselves are enemies).

People have to recognize clandestine operations, such as the information in chapter ten.

Challenging the elite will agitate them into doing a false flag in order to change the dialogue; attacking you like cornered wild animal. If the predatory system is being challenged enough, be ready then to catch them in the act. They will first prepare people with predictive programming in media. Then after the event, reinforce with "news" media by criticizing those who do not sacrifice themselves to the state. They can jam phones²⁸⁶²⁸⁷, so be ready to use some means to document it in order to use that information to discredit them, take pictures if necessary.

Chapter twelve

To the future

Technology can either free you, or enslave you. Genetically modified crops may provide you with abundant nutrition, or starve you and render you sterile. Without the demand for external authority, weak individuals cannot empower corrupt individuals and thus psychological enslavement is not possible. Instead,

technologies will raise the standard of living. The use of planetary and solar resources for space travel will become available in the future, but only for those who have control of their impulses. Problems would not exist so much on Earth, but there are plenty of challenges beyond it.

What would the world look like if people did not demand authority outside of themselves? People will competitively drive to become increasingly competent, relationships will have significantly less problems, and the demand for government will also be significantly less. Capitalism will replace the parasitic system of today. As people cease to seek the government as an enabler, government will only be seen as a protection service, funded by voluntary indirect (i.e. sales tax) means. The management of this protection service and the amount of indirect taxes used to fund it will be the biggest issue during each election. The following are possibilities going into the future:

- As people become more competitive, real crimes will plummet as people will seek out greater self-control. Police forces may then be reduced saving resources from non-production.
- Citizen militias as a citizen army to reduce reliance on an 'official' standing army; much as the case in Switzerland.
- All infrastructures will be privately maintained. Perhaps firefighting will be an extension of insurance

companies, and highways will be maintained by some sort of toll scheme.

- Education privatized, which will allow more competitive education practices.
- You can have whatever you like with less people getting in your way; not exactly utopia, money and hard work would still exist, but the legal system and irrational tribalism will not hinder your progress.
- People would have better problem solving capabilities.
- Higher testosterone in men, builds muscle faster and easier, more attractive to women, less tired and lazy
- Easier for people to undergo fat loss without feminizing hormones in their environment.
- Cancer at pre-1950's levels
- Wars much less common without the elites manipulating the military into conflicts
- Media that does not manipulate people into culture wars
- Technology lowers the cost of capital
- Privatizing the space industry will allow private businesses go into space races with more efficiency than governments.
- Competitive infrastructure building
- Separate corporations and government from each other so that there is a free market. Businesses like Monsanto and Haliburton would be able to compete in a free market
- Weather modification for good use (i.e. drought relief)

Now take this information and apply your operant conditioning for your success, both for yourself and the system. Make sure that you have a detailed plan; the more detailed the better. When you help yourself, there is a positive spillover effect for others as well.
